## **Primary Purpose**

The advanced trainee in palliative medicine is an accredited training position with the Chapter of Palliative Medicine, Royal Australasian College of Physician. Under supervision from specialist medical staff, the trainee will undertake clinical duties in alignment with the college's palliative care curriculum.

The Department of Palliative Care is accredited to provide 12 months of core advanced training terms in

- -inpatient palliative care unit / hospice
- -inpatient palliative care consultation service
- -community palliative care outreach.

The site is also approved for non core and elective terms.

## **Organisational Environment**

The Department of Palliative Care at Calvary Mater Newcastle is a level 6 comprehensive multidisciplinary specialist palliative care service. The service provides integrated care across 24 hour community outreach, hospital consultation, ambulatory outpatient clinic, specialist inpatient unit and telehealth / regional outreach models.

The department has a robust research and education framework and ample opportunity for trainees to undertake project research work.

The department is part of the Hunter New England Palliative and End of Life Care Stream.

Calvary Mater Newcastle (CMN) is situated in Waratah, Newcastle, in the heart of the Hunter region. The hospital is an affiliated hospital under the Health Services Act and one of only two affiliated hospitals left in NSW. It provides services to people of the Hunter New England region and Country NSW. CMN is a fully accredited hospital by the Australian Council on Health Care Standards.

CMN is a 195 bed facility and is the Hunter region's major centre for oncology (cancer) services, haematology, clinical toxicology and research. These services are supported by the intensive care unit, oncology treatment, surgery, general medicine and palliative care. While the hospital provides emergency, general medical and surgical care, we also specialise in the diagnosis and treatment of blood diseases, breast cancer and melanoma.

The hospital is also home to the Newcastle Melanoma Unit and Hunter Breast Screen, and has a stroke unit which provides a seamless care approach to stroke treatment and assessment for people of the Hunter.

The Department's goal is to provide the highest quality specialist care for patients and their families/carers with active progressive far advanced disease where the prognosis is limited and where quality of life issues are the central concern. This care and support extends into the bereavement phase. Patients within the department have advanced illness and most have been undergoing oncological treatments for some years. The demographic background of the patients is in regional areas of the Hunter Valley as well as metropolitan regions.

The department is involved in the teaching of Medical, Nursing and Allied Health Students from the University of Newcastle.

- Provide clinical services within the operational procedures and workflows of the palliative care service, including community based triage, activity data collection and reporting, PCOC national benchmarking and electronic medical records.
- Timely assessment of referrals, in accordance with documented triage or urgency criteria.
- Impeccable assessment of patient and carer needs, participation in collaborative management planning.
- Timely, accurate and relevant documentation of clinical activity, care plans and communication with the multidisciplinary team and primary health care provider / referring physician (eg general practitioner).
- Timely and accurate completion of the patient's electronic notes.
- The advanced trainee, with support of a staff specialist, will participate in the Department of Palliative Care on-call roster covering a weekend ward round for hospice inpatients, and after hours and weekend on-call.
- Attendance, participation and stewardship in departmental community multidisciplinary team meetings, contribution to case based discussions and development of care plans.
- Provision of evidence based, best practice palliative care in accordance with departmental policies and procedures.
- Prescribe medications as per PBS, legislative and departmental policy frameworks.

## Service Development & Innovation:

- Maintain a high level of patient care and make clinical decisions in accordance with best quality patient care.
- Liaise with general practitioners in matters concerning the clinical condition of patients, especially in respect of emergency admissions, deteriorating health or death.
- Participate in handover processes and maintain high level of clinical communication and multidisciplinary care.
- Participates in continuing professional development activities.
- Contribute to ongoing service development and change, to maintain high quality patient, family and community centered multidisciplinary care.
- Demonstrate commitment to professional development and quality through active participation in professional development reviews and feedback.
- Undertake audit and research work where relevant.

## Wise Stewardship:

- Maximise the benefit of the limited resources available for clinical care and service delivery through multidisciplinary collaborative care and adherence to operating procedures and workflows of the palliative care service.
