Our Organisation

Catholic Education Sandhurst Limited (CES Ltd) is committed to the mission of Catholic Education across the Diocese of Sandhurst. With a rich history dating back to 1853 the Diocese reaches from Central to Northwest Victoria. The organisation supports more than 3000 employees in 52 schools and 2 early childhood facilities. It also provides support to 4 secondary schools owned and operated by Religious Institutes.

CES Ltd participates and cooperates in the work of the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria Ltd (CECV), which has key responsibilities for the allocation and distribution of government funding, facilitating cooperation across the four Victorian Dioceses, and in working and cooperating with government statutory authorities.

The Chief Executive Officer of Catholic Education Sandhurst is appointed by the Board of CES Ltd to support the organisational, administrative, support and service matters related to Catholic schools within the Diocese.

The Chief Executive Officer and all delegations via that position operate within the parameters of Canon Law and the Catholic Church structures and processes. CES Ltd is the employing authority for its schools and acknowledges and respects the role of Parish Priests within the Parish communities in which schools are located and supported.

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Our Vision

Position Summary

The Catholic Identity Leader plays a key role in fostering the religious and spiritual life of the school community. This leadership position involves guiding staff, students, and families in nurturing and promoting the school's Catholic ethos, ensuring the faith formation of all members is central to the school experience.

The Catholic Identity Leader collaborates with the Principal, Deputy Principal, and Parish to lead the development and implementation of liturgies, sacramental programs, and key religious events such as masses and paraliturgies. The role also encompasses supporting staff in their Religious Education Accreditation, guiding the Religious Education (RE) team, and monitoring the RE curriculum to ensure a comprehensive and faith-filled experience for students.

Leadership Framework

This role will work within the CES Ltd Leadership Framework. The Framework sets out that Leadership in a Catholic School creates a vision for a community in which all may have life and have it in abundance (John 10:10) and where student flourishing is the core purpose. Leaders in Catholic schools are guided by religious, professional, ethical, and moral principles and pursue this vision in service of the community. Servant leadership is at the core of all levels of leadership in the Catholic school. The leadership vision is student centred with a growth mindset that is guided by a belief in the dignity and potential of the human person.

Leadership in a Catholic school includes seven professional practices that are valued as critical elements in leading a Catholic school. They are as follows:

- Leading the Catholic School
- Leading a Well Community
- · Leading Learning and Teaching
- Developing Self and Others

- Leading Improvement, Innovation and Change
- Leading the Management of the School
- Engaging and working with the Community

Key Responsibilities

Leading Catholic Identity

- Foster a strong Catholic identity by promoting the school's mission, vision, and values.
- Lead the Religious Education (RE) Team to ensure effective delivery of the RE curriculum and alignment with Catholic traditions and teachings.
- Ensure consistent and compliant documentation of all sacramental programs, liturgies, and religious events, including school-wide masses, liturgies, and key religious celebrations.
- Collaborate with the Parish and Canonical Administrator to strengthen relationships between the school, parish, and wider Catholic community.

Religious Education and Faith Development

- Support staff in achieving their Religious Education Accreditation, providing opportunities for professional learning and growth in Catholic education.
- Guide the development and implementation of the school's RE scope and sequence, ensuring comprehensive coverage of religious education topics across all grade levels.
- Work closely with the Sacrament Team to coordinate, implement, and review sacramental programs such as Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
- Provide support to teachers in delivering RE content and assist with classroom activities related to faith formation.

Liturgical Leadership

- Lead the preparation and coordination of whole-school masses, liturgies, and key events, including the beginning-of-year Mass, Ash Wednesday, and Graduation Mass.
- Ensure the availability of appropriate resources for religious celebrations, such as prayer tables, cloths, and Godly Play materials.
- Organise and oversee altar server training, Eucharistic Minister training, and the promotion of liturgical events within the school community.
- Promote active participation in social justice initiatives, including Caritas, Vinnies, and other community outreach programs aligned with Catholic teachings.

Building a Catholic Culture

- Promote and lead social justice initiatives that align with Catholic values, encouraging student and staff participation in charity and outreach programs.
- Actively and publicly support the Catholic ethos of the school, fostering
 a faith-filled environment where Catholic values are lived and
 celebrated.
- Ensure the school community's compliance with Child Safe Standards and the School Code of Conduct, promoting a safe, inclusive, and supportive environment for all.
- Collaborate with staff and leadership to strategically plan for the future of Catholic Identity at the school, drawing insights from data such as ECSI results and feedback from the community.

Developing Self and Others

- Lead staff spirituality and professional development days focused on Catholic identity and religious education.
- Collaborate with school leadership to foster a culture of continuous improvement in faith formation and Catholic education across the school.

Carry out all other duties that are within the limits of the skill, ability, competence, and training of the employee, and aligned with the requirements of the role as may be directed from time to time.

Mandatory Responsibilities and Requirements

Compliance with CES Ltd Policies and Procedures

- employees and ensure that they have the skills required to perform tasks safely, ensuring training is provided to address any knowledge or skills gaps for performing work safely, ensuring clear policies and procedures are implemented as well as holding regular OH&S meetings with employees and managing non-compliance.
- All employees will be required to provide evidence of vaccination status prior to commencing employment with CES Ltd. Depending on the role some employees will also be required to provide evidence of successful completion of First Aid Certificate inclusive of Anaphylaxis training.
