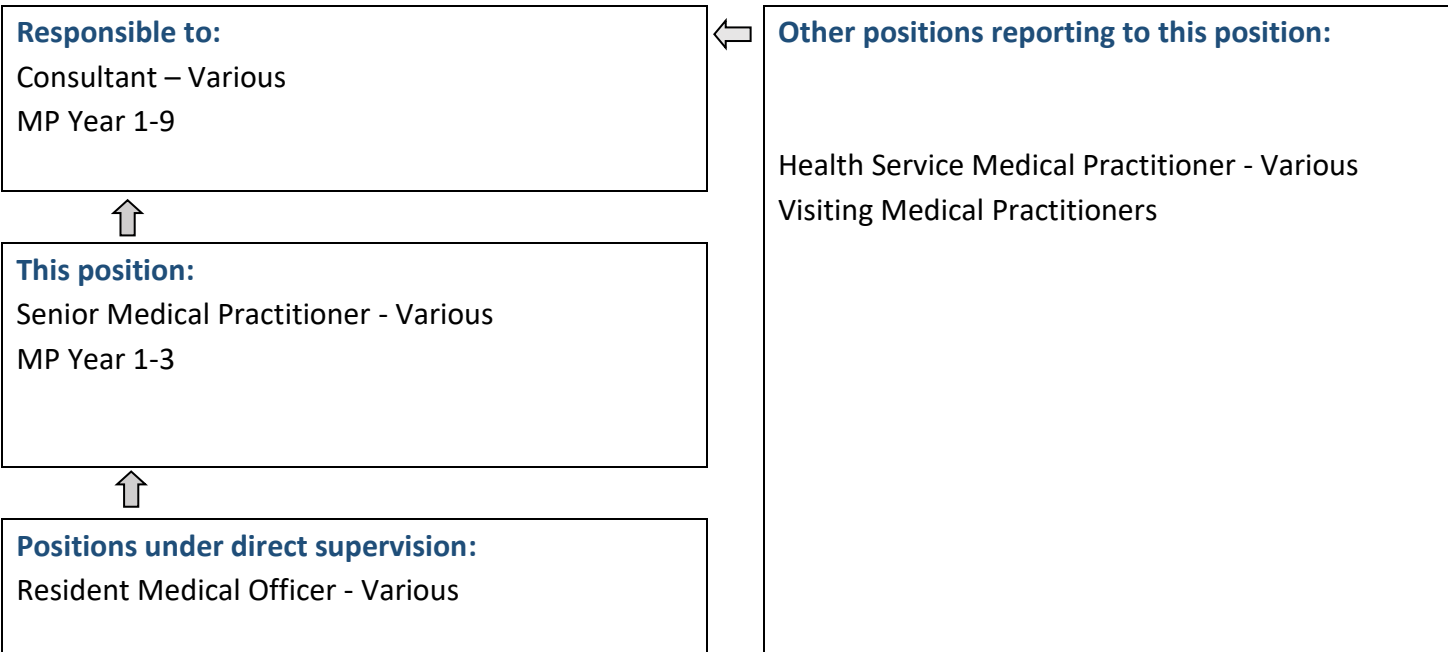

## Position Overview

Works as part of a multi-disciplinary team throughout the health services across WA Country Health Service. Providing a high standard of medical care and provides assessment, management advice and care of patients in Emergency Departments (ED) and those admitted to the General Wards. Provides leadership, training, supervision and education for Doctors in Training in consultation with Specialists and senior staff.

## Key Duties/Responsibilities

### 1. CLINICAL DUTIES

- 1.1. Manages patients in consultation with the Consultant and other senior medical staff and advises of important changes relative to patient conditions.
- 1.2. Provides one or more of the following services:
  - 1.2.1. Antenatal, peri partum and post-natal care commensurate with level of skill, experience and qualifications.
  - 1.2.2. Anaesthetic services commensurate with level of skill, experience and qualifications;
  - 1.2.3. Admits patients to the hospital according to need and manages their care either alone or in conjunction with the appropriate medical colleague whenever it will improve patient care.
  - 1.2.4. Manages acute patients in the Emergency Department as required.
- 1.3. Attends to patients in ED and those admitted as inpatients to the General Wards.
- 1.4. Provides satisfactory written documentation of each episode of patient management at time of discharge from the ward.
- 1.5. Works with nursing staff to facilitate patient management.
- 1.6. Communicates with patient's next of kin, General Practitioner and Specialist as appropriate.
- 1.7. Escorts patients to other institutions as directed.
- 1.8. Participates in after hours and weekend rosters.
- 1.9. Performs duties in accordance with relevant unit protocols and guidelines.
- 1.10. Works cooperatively with medical staff in other departments in the management of all patients.

### 2. ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES

- 2.1. Participates with data collection and quality improvement activities.
- 2.2. Prepares medical reports in liaison with senior medical staff.
- 2.3. Participates in research where appropriate.
- 2.4. Documents clinical notes on each patient to meet medical record standards.
- 2.5. Undertakes ongoing professional development to maintain professional and technical skills.
- 2.6. Active involvement in educational activities.
- 2.7. Assist in the supervision of junior medical officer in the Inpatient areas.

### 3. Other

- 3.1. Performs other duties as required.





## Work Related Requirements

The following criteria are to be read together with the Brief Summary of Duties and considered in the context of the WACHS Values.

### Essential

1. Eligible for registration by the Medical Board of Australia.
2. Substantial experience as a Medical Practitioner in general medicine and/or emergency medicine.
3. Relevant skills and experience to work in rural and remote WA as an independent senior practitioner.
4. Demonstrated highly developed communication and interpersonal skills.
5. Ability to work in a multi-disciplinary team environment.
6. Eligible for / or in possession of a current C or C-A Class drivers licence.

### Desirable

1. Demonstrated commitment to ongoing education and research.
2. Current knowledge of legislative obligations for Equal Opportunity, Disability Services and Occupational Safety and Health and how these impact on employment and service delivery

## Appointment Pre-requisites

Appointment is subject to:

- Evidence of registration by the Medical Board of Australia must be provided prior to commencement.
- Provision of the minimum identity proofing requirements
- Successful Criminal Record Screening Clearance
- Successful Pre-Employment Health Assessment
- Successful WA Health Integrity Check
- Successful Working With Children Check – if essential to location of employment.
- Evidence of a current C or C-A Class driver's licence.
