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Key Duties/Responsibilities

1. Professional, Clinical and Leadership

- 1.1. The key performance Indicators that relate to this position and unit are as follows. These are subject to change or addition as per WACHS Policy.
- Performance
 - 1. Rate of community follow up of mental health patients within 7 days =>75%
 - 2. Rate of readmission to mental health ward within 28 days =<12%
 - 3. % patients with a management plan on PSOLIS =>80%
- 1.2. Works closely with the Team Leader of the Infant, Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (ICAMHS) to lead, coordinate and direct the ICAMHS team in accordance with the strategic direction laid out by senior management, health service policy, legislation and clinical governance priorities.
- 1.3. Assumes a clinical leadership role in ensuring the provision of high quality care and optimal clinical outcomes for all consumers and their families admitted to the service.

2. Clinical

- 2.1. Undertakes the duties of a Consultant Psychiatrist as specified in the WA Mental Health Act 2014.
- 2.2. Assumes accountability for the clinical care provided to consumers admitted under their care of the team.
- 2.3. When providing direct treatment, assesses, diagnoses and manages the care of individuals' mental illness, associated comorbid physical disorders, and psychosocial needs. Assesses and manages risk.
- 2.4. Conducts regular clinical reviews of the consumers under their care.
- 2.5. Actively involves consumers their families and carers in planning their individual care.
- 2.6. Maintains timely, detailed and legible patient records.
- 2.7. Actively participates as a member of the multidisciplinary team (MDT), and actively promotes MDT working within the service.
- 2.8. Ensures familiarity with, and works within, relevant legislation and policy.
- 2.9. Liaises and consults with colleagues, GP's, Paediatricians, Education, Child Protection agencies and any other relevant external agencies regarding client management and discharge plans.
- 2.10. Ensures safe handover of care on discharge from the service.
- 2.11. Collaborates with and advises the Clinical Director on clinical and organisational governance issues affecting the team.
- 2.12. Manages emergencies, as required.
- 2.13. Provides cover for colleagues for short term or unplanned leave.
- 2.14. Undertakes clinical shifts at the direction of the Clinical Director, including participation in the after-hours and weekend on call roster as rostered.

3. Education, Training and Performance Management

- 3.1. Undertakes ongoing professional development to maintain professional and technical skills at an advanced level and to maintain relevant specialist and professional medical registration.
- 3.2. Participates as an active member of the service's continuing medical education program and Consultant Psychiatrists Peer Group meetings.

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- 3.3. Supervises registrars in training for the RANZCP and other staff, as required.
- 3.4. Participates in the teaching of medical graduates and undergraduates, nursing and allied health staff.
- 3.5. Keeps up to date with WACHS mandatory training requirements.
- 3.6. Participates in annual performance development review with the Clinical Director

4. Governance, Quality and Safety

- 4.1. Fulfils National Safety and Quality Health Services Standards requirements, including, but not limited to:
- Actively participates in a continuous process to monitor, evaluate and develop performance of the CAMHS team.
- Takes part in the development, monitoring and review of key performance and quality assurance metrics.
- Initiates and participates in audit, research projects and actively promotes research to facilitate service development.
- Supports the delivery of safe patient care with a clear focus on the consumer's experience.
- Participates in the reporting and review of clinical incidents, including root cause analysis, and takes part in the implementation and evaluation of recommendations.
- 4.2. Promotes the South West Mental Health Service through liaison with other service providers, public relations, publications and lectures, as appropriate

5. Other

- 5.1. Performs duties in accordance with Government, WA Health, WA Country Health Service, and service/ program specific policies and procedures including the relevant occupational health and safety and health legislation, Equal Opportunity legislation, and WA Health Code of Conduct.
- 5.2. Works within the scope of clinical practice as approved by the WACHS medical credentialing committee.
- 5.3. All doctors' work in the South West Mental Health Service is assumed to be in accordance with the terms of the relevant industrial (AMA) award.
- 5.4. Undertakes other duties as directed



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Work Related Requirements

The following criteria are to be read together with the Brief Summary of Duties and considered in the context of the WACHS Values.

- 1. Eligible for registration by the Medical Board of Australia.
- 2. Fellowship of the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists (or equivalent).
- 3. Higher level training and experience in Infant, Child and Adolescent Psychiatry sufficient to allow practice as a specialist within this area
- 4. Demonstrated significant clinical experience managing high acuity patients in an acute mental health setting.
- Knowledge and experience of working within the Western Australian Mental Health Act 2014 and other relevant mental health legislation (or equivalent other jurisdiction's Mental Health Act legislation).
- 6. Demonstrated ability to provide clinical leadership and work as part of a multidisciplinary team.
- 7. Demonstrated ability to understand service strategic and operational requirements, and implement sustainable change to improve patient safety and reduce access blocks or delays in access to care.
- 8. Demonstrated effective communication, interpersonal and conflict resolution skills, including the ability to represent the organisation externally.
- 9. Demonstrated commitment to working closely with consumers and families to deliver recovery orientated and patient centred care.
- 10. Experience in providing services to clients from diverse backgrounds, and demonstrated cultural competence skills.
- 11. Demonstrated experience and ability to effectively supervise junior medical staff.
- 12. Current C or C-A Class driver's licence.
