Anatomical Pathology Registrar

The trainee registrar will work as part of a team providing diagnostic and consultative haematology and have excellent training opportunities and involvement in a wide range of haematology including general haematology, coagulation, transfusion, flow cytometry, cytogenetics, molecular medicine, and autologous stem cell transplantation.

The positions are accredited for 4 years' training for the Fellowship of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia and is also recognised for advanced training for Fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians (JSAC).

Applicants must be eligible for medical registration in Australia.

Microbiology Registrar

The Royal Hobart Hospital provides a comprehensive tertiary diagnostic and consultative microbiology service, as part of an integrated Department of Microbiology and Infectious Diseases. The Microbiology Registrar will have excellent training opportunities and gain experience in a wide range of microbiology including general bacteriology, mycology, parasitology, virology, serology, mycobacteriology and molecular medicine. In addition the registrar will participate in clinical liaison, infection control and antimicrobial stewardship activities. Participation in the Department's educational activities is expected and involvement in Departmental research encouraged.

The position is accredited for 4 years' training for the Fellowship of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia and is also accredited for advanced training in Infectious Diseases by the Royal Australasian College of Physicians.

Applicants must be eligible for medical registration in Australia.

Microbiology and Infectious Diseases

The Royal Hobart Hospital (RHH) is Tasmania's largest hospital providing a full range of tertiary level services for the state. The Department of Microbiology and Infectious Diseases provides a comprehensive and integrated infectious diseases and clinical microbiology service for the RHH, and outreach services to the North West of the Tasmania. The Department is currently staffed by six staff specialist Infectious Diseases Physicians / Microbiologists who supervise two Advanced Trainees (in Infectious Diseases and Microbiology) and a dedicated Resident Medical Officer rotated from the Basic Physician Training Scheme.

The Infectious Diseases service provides direct care for inpatients, a consultative service (currently seeing approximately 500 consults per annum) and runs weekly general infectious diseases, HIV, refugee health and TB clinics and an Outpatient Antibiotic Program. The Infectious Diseases registrar also assists in weekly viral hepatitis and sexual health clinics and may participate in regular liaison rounds with colleagues in the Departments of Hematology and Critical Care Medicine. In addition, the registrar will assist in the hospital's Antimicrobial Stewardship Program and have the opportunity to be involved with the activities of the Infection Prevention and Control Unit.

Dependent on the needs and wishes of the Department's two Advanced Trainees there may be an opportunity to gain up to six months of laboratory experience in microbiology, which is currently approved as Advanced Training by both the Royal Australasian College of Physicians and Pathologists.

The Department has an active educational program and participation in this is expected. Involvement in Departmental research activities is also encouraged, as is attendance at relevant Australian conferences (e.g. ASID or ASA).

This position is accredited for advanced training in Infectious Diseases and / or Microbiology. It would also be suitable for trainees in General Medicine or other disciplines seeking an elective year in Infectious Diseases.

Applicants are welcome to apply for either 12 months of single training, or six months in both specialties.
