The School of Dentistry

The UQ School of Dentistry has a long and proud tradition of 81 years of strength in dental education and research, and attracts high achieving students nationally and internationally. UQ is a leading source of expertise in the local, national and international dental community and has been a key contributor to achieving effective solutions to contemporary issues and challenges. The School has strong collaborations within and outside the dental profession.

As part of the Faculty of Health and Behavioural Sciences, the School of Dentistry offers the Bachelor of Dental Science (Honours) program and specialist post-graduate programs (Doctor of Clinical Dentistry). The School of Dentistry also has a growing cohort of research higher degree students.

The Oral Health Centre (OHC)

The OHC opened in January 2015. This award winning building is the largest and best equipped facility for patient treatment, dental education and research in Australasia. The OHC has over 150 chairs across 11 clinics and 2 general anaesthetic theatres, a PC2 laboratory catering to a range of laboratory based research, 2 clinical simulation laboratories, 2 auditoriums and a seminar room complex.

The OHC's location on the Herston campus provides an excellent interface with other disciplines and health services, with the nearby Royal Brisbane & Women's Hospital, the UQ Faculty of Medicine and School of Public Health, and the UQ Centre for Clinical Research. New teaching and research facilities (including expanded simulation labs) and new equipment at the forefront of current technology used in dentistry have allowed the School of Dentistry to commence a refreshed and innovative undergraduate dental program, along with an expanded range of postgraduate programs.

The Oral Health Alliance (OHA)

From January 2017, the OHA integrated the activities of Metro North Hospital and Health Service Oral Health Services and the UQ School of Dentistry to establish world-class activities in clinical teaching, research and service provision in oral health, headquartered around the state-of-the-art Oral Health Centre on the co-located Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital and UQ campus at Herston.

Population Oral Health at UQ (POHUQ)

POHUQ is supported by a UQ VC Strategic Funding and a number of NHMRC research grants to conduct high quality population oral health research.

DUTY STATEMENT

Primary Purpose of Position

A Postdoctoral Research Fellow will focus their efforts on developing their expertise and emerging research profile in the field of oral epidemiology and dental public health. At this level it is expected that the incumbent will contribute to service and engagement roles and activities.

As a research focused academic at level A the incumbent will be supported and guided by more senior academic research staff with the expectation of an increasing degree of autonomy over time.

Duties

The duties and responsibilities include, but are not limited to

Research Focused Academic Level A

Research

- Develop a coherent research program and an emerging research profile in the area of oral epidemiology and dental public health.
- Work with colleagues and postgraduates in the development of joint research projects for competitive research funding support.
- Participate in applications for competitive research funding support.
- Publish or exhibit in high quality outlets (often in collaboration with colleagues).
- Assist in the supervision of Honour student and Higher Degree by Research students (as appropriate).
- Review and draw upon best practice research methodologies.

- Prepare research publications and progress reports and participate in regular meetings to discuss project objectives, methodology and outcomes.

Service and Engagement

- Begin to develop external links by cultivating relationships with industry, government departments, professional bodies and the wider community.
- Contribute to internal service roles and processes, including participation in decision-making and service on relevant committees.
- Perform a range of administrative functions as required.
- Any other duties as reasonably directed by your supervisor.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Essential

Research Focused Academic Level A

- Completion or near completion of a PhD in the discipline area.
- An emerging profile in research in the area of oral epidemiology and dental public health.
- A strong record of publications in reputed refereed journals and presenting at conferences.
- Evidence of contributions towards successfully obtaining external research funding.
- Some experience in meaningful internal service roles and contributions towards external activities.
- Demonstrated supervisory skills, including some experience with postgraduate student supervision.
- An ability to establish effective relationships and to represent and promote research outcomes at a university and wider community level, including industry, government and professional bodies.
- Ability to perform in-depth and critical data analyses and data modelling.

Desirable

- Professional qualification and registration in a dental or oral health field.

Qualification Verification

An appointment to this position is subject to the verification of the highest academic qualification from the conferring institution.

Vaccinations and Immunisation
