UQ has a strong focus on teaching excellence, winning more national teaching excellence awards than any other in the country and attracting the majority of Queensland's highest academic achievers, as well as top interstate and overseas students.

UQ is one of Australia's Group of Eight, a charter member of edX and a founding member of Universitas 21, an international consortium of leading research-intensive universities.

Our 52,000-plus strong student community includes more than 16,400 postgraduate scholars and more than 15,400 international students from 135 countries, adding to its proud 250,000-plus alumni. The University has more than 6,600 academic and professional staff (full-time equivalent) and a \$1.75 billion annual operating budget. Its major campuses are at St Lucia, Gatton and Herston, in addition to teaching and research sites around Queensland and Brisbane city. The University has six Faculties and four University-level Institutes. The Institutes, funded by government and industry grants, philanthropy and commercialisation activities, have built scale and focus in research areas in neuroscience, biomolecular and biomedical sciences, sustainable minerals, bioengineering and nanotechnology, as well as social science research.

Primary Purpose of Position

As the Environment and Release Manager you will be accountable and responsible for the governance around the movement of all enterprise applications and changes across all environments from development to production. This role will manage and communicate environment availability and resolve conflicts between competing demands for environments and prioritise work schedules.

Duties

Duties and responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Manage and communicate environment availability and resolve conflicts between competing demands for environments and prioritise work schedules;
- Develop common strategies for release and environment management governance across a large transformation portfolio;
- Create common standards and formats for release playbooks and work with production control to standardise release decision-making;
- Define common mechanisms for rollback and standards for capturing release-related performance indicators;

- Forecast demand for release resources and identify opportunities for greater efficiency across the portfolio;
- The establishment of effective controls & communication protocols to manage and report release activities.
