# **Position Purpose**

- Diagnose vehicle faults and determine remedial action as required including procurement of parts and materials.
- Provide technical advice and guidance to mechanics, apprentices and trainees and assist in analysing problems, escalating to the Workshop Supervisor where required.
- Engage appropriately with a range of diverse internal and external stakeholders to ensure quality service delivery outcomes are achieved.
- Coordinate and carry out daily preventative and corrective maintenance, including mandatory annual inspections to Council's fleet of vehicles, plant and equipment.
- Ensure that preventive maintenance schedules are maintained and up to date for Council's vehicles, plant and equipment-
- Promote the safe, effective and efficient utilisation of tools, equipment and facilities within the mechanical Workshop in accordance with Council's workplace health and safety policies, procedures and practices.
