## Your work area

The International Centre for Radio Astronomy Research (ICRAR) is an equal joint venture established in 2009 between Curtin University and The University of Western Australia (UWA). ICRAR is one of the lead Australian organisations participating in the international Square Kilometre Array (SKA) Project. The Centre is engaged in research and training in radio astronomy, astrophysics, simulations, data intensive astronomy, engineering, SKA pre-construction and bridging activities. ICRAR has a very active education and outreach program and also works closely with international and Australian collaborators including partners from industry. ICRAR was independently assessed to be among the top five radio astronomy Centres in the world. The Centre is also a node of the ARC Centre of Excellence for All Sky Astrophysics in 3 Dimensions (ASTRO 3D). ICRAR strongly supports the principles of equity and diversity.

ICRAR was recently awarded the Astronomical Society of Australia (ASA) Gold Pleiades award for Inclusion, Diversity and Equity in Astronomy.

Supervise the collaborative SRC infrastructure prototyping activities and developments between AusSRC and other SRC projects in the Asia-Pacific region;
