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The Medical Coordinator's (MCs) main responsibility is to assist with organising and teaching of RCSWA students. 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In consultation with local medical practitioners and agencies maintain and further develop local educational programs that meet the requirements of the RCSWA and take advantage of local opportunities and strengths.

Deliver medical education and training to medical students and assist in the support of preceptors and host practitioners.

Arrange learning opportunities for medical students by liaising with local agencies.

Where possible, be involved in research and/or evaluation relevant to improving rural health.

Develop and coordinate the development of rural training pathways in local area of appointment and contribute to a statewide RCSWA approach.

Other duties as required.
