PURPOSE STATEMENT:

The University Experience Division is within the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) Portfolio. The University Experience Division provides a range of support, enrichment, and advisory services to help students achieve their university educational goals.

The Medical Centre operates within the division and is located in Kambri on the Australian National University Acton campus and provides comprehensive high-quality care to students, staff and other members of the University community.

The Nurse Practitioner (NP) will contribute to the University's commitment through the provision of high-level clinical assessment and diagnosis and within the NP scope of practice as outlined by the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia.

KEY ACCOUNTABILITY AREAS:

Position Dimension & Relationships:

The position reports to the Head of Clinical Services and is responsible for the provision of high-quality clinical care for students, with a strong focus on international students.

This is a full-time (35 hours/week) position. ANU Medical Centre does not operate on weekends and after hours. This role does not require staff to be on call. However, where appropriate, Nurse Practitioner may be required to play a role in the University's response to critical incidents as determined by the Critical Incident Policy.

Role Statement:

Under broad direction, the Nurse Practitioner will:

- Provide advanced clinical assessment and autonomous care to patients in accordance with Nurse Practitioner legislation and within individual scope of practice.
- Use clinical, diagnostic and prescribing decisions that are evidence-based, use critical and reflective thinking and complex reasoning to analyse and guide assessments and clinical judgements.
- Practice with a high degree of autonomy and accountability and apply extended practice competencies within a nursing model ensuring that strategies and interventions, promote safe practice.

- Maintain client records and data in a manner which supports effective professional practice, and which contributes to the accountability of the service.
- Actively promote and maintain collaborative relationships with stakeholders, including university services, divisions, residential colleges, and the community to provide an integrated and coordinated approach to service delivery.
- Comply with all ANU policies and procedures, in particular those relating to work health and safety and equal opportunity.
- Other duties as required, consistent with the classification of the position and the principle of multi-skilling.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

- 1. Current registration as a Registered Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia and endorsement by the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia as a Nurse Practitioner. Relevant experience in working within a large and complex organisation will be highly regarded.
- 2. Demonstrated advanced clinical skills, competence and leadership in the assessment, treatment and management of clients presenting to the service for a number of health presentations. Interest in sexual health care, international student health and mental health care will be highly regarded.
- 3. Demonstrated ability to work independently and in the absence of a Medical Practitioner to provide quality care together with the capacity to work collaboratively as part of a multidisciplinary team.
- 4. Demonstrated ability to collect and report student's information in a timely manner, maintain confidentiality and accurate documentation to ensure necessary information is available to meet legal and ongoing care requirements.
- 5. Well-developed computer skills and willingness to utilise or learn Best Practice medical software.
- 6. High-level organisational skills, including the proven ability to work to deadlines to achieve operational outcomes and the ability to maintain a flexible and proactive approach to tasks within a busy work environment.
- 7. A demonstrated level of understanding of equal opportunity principles, policies and a commitment to their application in a University context.
