## Skills and Experience

- **Delivery**
  - For some high demand courses, we can deliver the same class in either asynchronous weekly 'WEB' mode; synchronous virtual weekly classes or VC (Zoom); fortnightly face-to-face; or over 2 weekend intensives. Depending on the mode, the time could be either spread out equally over the term or be more concentrated around an intensive weekend and assignment deadlines.
- **Marking**
  - In line with the Business School policy, we do expect our facilitators to do their own marking and, of course, provide good quality and specific feedback to each student. We estimate that most facilitators would spend about 1.5 hrs per student on marking.
