The Senior Research Associate (Level B) at the Kaldor Centre for International Refugee Law will carry out independent and team research in the field of international refugee law and forced migration and will lead the Kaldor Centre's research project on meaningful participation of refugees and other displaced people in decision-making processes.

The role of Senior Research Associate works within the Kaldor Centre for International Refugee Law in the Faculty of Law & Justice, reporting to the Head of the School of Global and Public Law, and has no direct reports.

Accountabilities

Specific accountabilities for this role include:

- Lead the Kaldor Centre's research project on meaningful participation of refugees in decisionmaking processes, conducting research under limited supervision, either independently or as a member of a team (as per the norms of the discipline).
- Engage with external stakeholders, including refugee-led organisations, civil society and policymakers, to inform law reform efforts in relation to meaningful refugee participation.
- Create scholarly impact in the discipline which is recognised by peers in the advancement of disciplinary knowledge.
- Contribute to the development of applications for competitive funding under the guidance of senior colleagues.

- Mentor and guide students and colleagues and develop the next generation of academics through involvement in supervision of HDRs (as per the norms of the discipline).
- Align with and actively demonstrate the <u>Code of Conduct and Values</u>
- Ensure hazards and risks psychosocial and physical are identified and controlled for tasks, projects, and activities that pose a health and safety risk within your area of responsibility.

Skills and Experience

- A PhD in a related discipline, and/or relevant work experience.
- Proven commitment to proactively keeping up to date with discipline knowledge and developments.
- Demonstrated track record in research relating to meaningful refugee participation with outcomes of high quality and high impact with clear evidence of the desire and ability to continually achieve research excellence as well as the capacity for research leadership.

- High level communication skills and ability to network effectively and interact with a diverse range of students and staff.
- Demonstrated ability to work in a team, collaborate across disciplines and build effective relationships.
