Position Summary

The successful applicant should have expertise in one of the following areas: Music Performance (Jazz and Pop), Songwriting or Music Technology. You will work in collaboration with partners and stakeholders and expand and build a network of community engagement in the context of the University's strategic plan. You will work closely with high schools and secondary colleges in the delivery of key music programs.

- Contribute to the development and maintenance of productive and effective links inside the University and locally and nationally with the discipline, relevant interdisciplinary domains, profession, industry and wider community particularly high schools and secondary colleges.
- Undertake other duties as assigned by the supervisor.

- A four-year tertiary qualification in a relevant field and/or equivalent qualifications and/or professional experience.
- A demonstrated ability and understanding of research in the field of Music, demonstrated by a strong academic record, and preferably, enrolment in and/or partial completion of a PhD.
- Experience in University-level tutoring, teaching and learning within the field of expertise.
- A record of contributing to building and maintaining effective and productive networks with the discipline, profession, industry and wider community.
