 - Demonstrated experience in University-level teaching and learning, with skills and experience in online and blended teaching skills, unit coordination, curriculum design, flexible course delivery, and multi-campus teaching.
- A proven record of building and maintaining effective and productive links locally, nationally, and internationally (Level D) with the discipline, profession, industry (where relevant) and wider community.

Other position requirements

- Studio based teaching and learning expertise in a specialised fine art studio: including time-based media, drawing, printmaking, painting, sculpture and/or participatory practice
- Regular travel may be required between campuses in Launceston and Hobart to deliver teaching and learning outcomes
