Position Summary

The position will develop and deliver supervision skills within the general practice team to ensure general practice-based projects can be sustained over the longer term.

The incumbent will be responsible for organising, promoting and supporting collaboration with general practice clinicians and other team members around the theme of research which may include audit or other quality improvement activities. The appointee will also be required to undertake administrative duties in relation to the position.
