In 2018, MADA is introducing a Master of Urban Planning & Design to explore contemporary issues in urban planning. It is expected that there will be about 20 students enrolled in the first year. MADA intends to position its presence in urban planning by integrating policy-based methods with spatial processes, and will have an overt interdisciplinary and collaborative approach. The course extends the existing urban research and teaching in the Department of Architecture through the delivery of four planning projects - the Compact City, the Ecological City, the Sprawling City and the Inclusive City – all of which explore the impacts of the growth and transformation of cities as we move through this century. The course expands traditional planning education to include integrative design approaches that can develop the important skills required for planners to meet the future city's cultural, economic and climatic challenges.

The discipline will be located in the Department of Architecture and will have strong connections with other urban thinkers in faculties and research centres across Monash University, including the Cooperative Research Centre for Water Sensitive Cities, the Monash Sustainability Institute and the Monash Infrastructure Institute. The course will be locally and internationally networked with a broad community of practitioners, educators and researchers, with students drawn from many disciplines and backgrounds.

The Master of Urban Planning and Design will join a suite of outstanding academic programs at MADA that strive to be relevant to contemporary global issues and sensitive to regional contexts, including community engagement, inclusion and resilience. MADA encourages connections between art, design, architecture, and

now urban planning, through teaching, research as well as integrating with other disciplines to solve emerging societal challenges.

A Level B academic is expected to make contributions to the teaching effort of the university and to carry out activities to maintain and develop their scholarly, research and/or professional activities relevant to the profession or discipline.

Key responsibilities

Specific duties required of a Level B academic may include:

- 1. The preparation and conduct of tutorials, practical classes, demonstrations, workshops, student field excursions, clinical sessions and studio sessions at all levels, particularly in international business/management units onshore, on and off campus, through face to face teaching and online provision
- 2. The conduct of research and developing a record of achievement in the discipline; including high-quality publications (targeting A and A* journals where possible) and grants
- 3. Broad administrative functions; the majority of which are connected with the subjects in which the academic teaches, such as marking and assessment
- 4. Supervision of the program of study of honours students and of postgraduate students engaged in course work and where appropriate, in the Higher Degrees Research program
- 5. Development of course material with appropriate advice from and support of more senior staff, in accordance with the requirements of the Department academic workload policy
- 6. Attending departmental, school and/or faculty meetings and a major role in planning or committee work
- 7. Embracing and supporting the faculty's commitment to national and international accreditation (i.e. TEQSA, EQUIS, AACSB and AMBA)

Key selection criteria

Education/Qualifications

- 1. The incumbent will possess:
 - Research doctorate or equivalent higher degree in relevant field with an emphasis on urban planning, or, in exceptional circumstances, demonstration of equivalence through research-based practice

Knowledge and skills

- A record of disciplinary excellence and academic engagement evidenced through relevant research publications, practice-based design research and professional esteem or track record in obtaining external research grants
- 3. A high level of interpersonal skills and demonstrated ability to work independently and collaboratively across both the academic and service sectors
- 4. Ability to work positively and cooperatively with students, internal and external teams and agencies
- 5. Demonstrated strong record of teaching experience in a tertiary environment (i.e. through evaluations, innovations and/or curriculum development)
- 6. Demonstrated ability to stimulate, actively engage and educate a given audience at undergraduate and postgraduate levels
