The SPAHC is a leader in primary and allied care research, teaching and service. Position purpose

This should be completed either independently and/or as part of team research within the field in which the Head of Schools area of research expertise for which he/she is appointed and to carry out activities to develop her/his individual research expertise relevant to the particular field of research.

Key responsibilities

Specific duties required of a Level B academic may include:

- To provide high level support to the Head of School in the conduct of research activities either as a member of a team or independently and the production of conference and seminar papers and publications from that research
- 2. Supervision of research-support staff involved in the staff member's research
- 3. Guidance in the research effort of junior members of Academic staff in her/his research area
- 4. Contribution to the preparation or, where appropriate, individual preparation of research proposal submissions to external funding bodies
- 5. Involvement in professional activities including, subject to availability of funds, attendance at conferences and seminars in the field of expertise
- 6. Administrative functions primarily connected with the Head of Schools research grants and her/his own area of research
- 7. Occasional contributions to the teaching program within the field of the staff member's research
- 8. Co-supervision or, where appropriate, supervision of major honours or postgraduate research projects within the field of the staff member's area of research: and
- 9. Attendance at meetings associated with research or the work of the organisational unit to which the research is connected and/or at departmental, school and/or faculty meetings and/or membership of a limited number of committees

Key selection criteria

A Level B academic shall have:-

- Demonstrated statistical analysis and manuscript preparation skills; including a solid track record of refereed research publications, or evidence of an emerging track record of publications, e.g. as per the Australian Business Deans Council (ABDC) 2013 list: http://www.abdc.edu.au/pages/abdc-journal-quality-list-2013.html
- 2. Demonstrated ability to stimulate, actively engage and educate a given audience, and achieve good learning outcomes over a sustained period
- 3. Possess a high level of interpersonal skills and demonstrated ability to work independently and as part of a team across both the education and service sectors
- 4. Ability to work positively and cooperatively with students, internal and external teams and agencies
- 5. Demonstrated capacity to make a solid contribution to the Schools education, scholarly and administrative activities and tasks
