POSITION PURPOSE

The Associate Professor will provide high level academic and research leadership in the Faculty of Education & Arts to ensure excellence in teaching and learning, research and research training, and community engagement.

The appointee will be a highly productive researcher of national/international standing who will lead the development of the Faculty's profile in the relevant discipline area, research performance and reputation through competitive grants, publications, consultancies and attraction of research higher degree students to ACU's programs. As part of the appointment the successful applicant may be required to fill a position of leadership and be responsible for the strategic development and overall management of a portfolio in the Faculty of Education & Arts.

The appointee must be able to effectively communicate and engage in the constructive conversations that motivate staff, students and external stakeholders of the University to achieve the goals of the Faculty and to respond effectively to the needs of the different education sectors. It is expected that the appointee to the position will advance the standing of the Faculty by providing a contribution to academic administration, research, curriculum development, program coordination, and working collaboratively across the Faculty, the University (for example, teaching Core Curriculum units) and with external partners.

The appointee will provide leadership in the teaching of Education Studies in both undergraduate and graduate entry initial teacher education programs, as well as postgraduate education programs, in both face to face and online modes. The appointee in Education Studies will have expertise in the psychology of learning and teaching and the application of this to learning environments and teacher practice. They will actively contribute to the leadership of the National Education Studies discipline team. The appointee will demonstrate a strong work ethic and commitment to University's Mission in leading and mentoring staff in the discipline and providing excellent student experience.
