Position purpose

The **Department of Community Emergency Health and Paramedic Practice (DCEHPP)** provides undergraduate and postgraduate courses to students currently working in or planning employment in out-of-hospital and community based emergency health settings. The core business of DCEHPP is to:

- Provide education and training services to meet the needs of ambulance services and of private patient transport services in Australia and internationally;
- Provide education programs for paramedics from Australia and overseas and other health professionals in the field of community-based emergency health; and
- Undertake research in the field of community-based emergency health and paramedic practice

DCEHPP is a leader in paramedic education, training and research, and has longstanding contractual agreements with Ambulance Victoria in the provision of Intensive Care Paramedic and Flight Intensive Care Paramedic training, and the Metropolitan Fire Brigade Services Board and their Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) program. DCEHPP offers one of the national's most prestigious undergraduate programs: Bachelor of Emergency Health (BEH), and has done so for over 10 years. This degree offers potential paramedics with opportunities to work within an emergency ambulance service, and other community-based health settings in many parts of the world.

Financial delegation and/or budget responsibilities: This position has no financial delegation or budget responsibilities

Key responsibilities

A Level B academic is expected to make contributions to the teaching effort of the university and to carry out activities to maintain and develop her/his scholarly, research and/or professional activities relevant to the profession or discipline.

Specific duties required of a Level B academic may include:

- 1. The conduct of tutorials, practical classes, demonstrations, workshops, student field excursions, clinical sessions and studio sessions
- 2. Development of course material with appropriate advice from and support of more senior staff
- 3. The initiation and development of subject material
- 4. The preparation and delivery of lectures and seminars
- 5. Supervision of major honours or postgraduate research projects
- Supervision of the program of study of honours students and of postgraduate students engaged in course work
- 7. The conduct of research
- 8. Involvement in professional activity
- 9. Consultation with students
- 10. Broad administrative functions; the majority of which are connected with the subjects in which the academic teaches
- 11. Marking and assessment
- Attendance at departmental, school and/or faculty meetings and a major role in planning or committee work

A Level B academic shall have qualifications and/or experience recognised by the university as appropriate for the relevant discipline area. In many cases a position at this level will require a doctoral or masters qualification or equivalent accreditation and standing. In determining experience relative to qualifications, regard is had to teaching experience, experience in research, experience outside tertiary education, creative achievement, professional contributions and/or contributions to technical achievement.

Key selection criteria

Essential Criteria

- 1. Advanced qualifications and/or recognised significant experience in the relevant discipline area; this may include paramedicine, medicine, nursing, and/or allied health care. A position at this level will normally require a doctoral qualification (or working towards) or equivalent accreditation and standing
- 2. Previous experience as a lecturer and/or other relevant teaching experience
- 3. A record of demonstrable scholarship, research and/or professional achievement in the area of health care e.g. a good publication record in high-quality refereed journals or equivalent (e.g. publications, textbooks or teaching resources)
- 4. Ability to plan, organise and achieve work targets, sometimes in demanding circumstances and work harmoniously and constructively with academic colleagues and other University staff
- 5. Effective communication and organisational skills in order to facilitate student learning and to provide support and advice to students
- 6. Demonstrated capacity to work in a collegiate manner with other staff and students in the workplace
- 7. Current practice experience within or industry related experience

Other job related information
