Established in 1874, the University of Adelaide is Australia's third oldest university.

With an international reputation for conducting world-leading research across a wide spectrum of areas, the University is consistently ranked in the top 1% of universities worldwide and is a member of the Group of Eight.

The University constitutes a vibrant and diverse community with more than 25,000 students representing over 90 countries and over 3,500 members of staff. There are three main campuses in South Australia located at North Terrace, Adelaide; Roseworthy; and Waite. The primary campus is centrally located on the city's cultural boulevard, North Terrace, in the heart of Adelaide. The University's five faculties are based at the North Terrace campus.

Research

Over 80% of the University's research areas were rated 'at or above world class' in the most recent Excellence in Research Australia (ERA) initiative that measures the quality and impact of research at Australian universities. Of all Australian universities, the University of Adelaide is the top performer in securing research grant funding, on a per capita basis, relative to its size.

The University of Adelaide is committed to delivering world-class research with tangible outputs of global significance. We have established five multidisciplinary research institutes to mobilise expertise across disciplines and across the world to, among other things, address the grand humanitarian challenges of ourtime.

These institutes bring together leading researchers and infrastructure to facilitate the most effective and progressive research reflecting national and global research priorities in the areas of agriculture, the environment, health and disease prevention, minerals and energy, photonics and advanced sensing.

Campuses

The University constitutes three campuses: Adelaide (North Terrace), Waite and Roseworthy.

Located in the heart of Adelaide, the North Terrace campus forms part of the city's cultural promenade surrounded by the state's art gallery, museum and library. The campus provides a mix of the historical and contemporary, combining old sandstone buildings with state-of-the-art teaching, learning and research facilities.

A reputation for excellence

The Faculty of Health and Medical Sciences at the University of Adelaide is recognised as a world leader in health education and research.

Our degrees are informed by cuttingedge research integrated with high quality teaching. Our academics include outstanding staff that are national and international leaders in their fields, providing a transformational student-centred learning experience. The Faculty of Health and Medical Sciences is the highest ranked faculty for research in South Australia. In Excellence in Research for Australia (ERA) 2015 evaluation the faculty received the highest possible overall Field of Research rating of 5, described as 'outstanding performance well above world standard'. With state-of-the-art facilities, new teaching styles, and the latest technologies including simulations and digital platforms, we are taking our degrees into the future and transporting health sciences education, research and patient care in South Australia.



ADELAIDE HEALTHAND MEDICAL SCIENCES BUILDING

The University of Adelaide's new Adelaide Health and Medical Sciences building transforms the waystudents learn, enhances the student experience and prepares future health care leaders for professional practice.

Located in the heart of the Adelaide BioMed City, the building's integration with the new Royal Adelaide Hospital (nRAH) and South Australian Health and Medical Research Institute (SAHMRI), builds upon the University's 130+ years of partnership with the RAH, and will facilitate greater research collaboration.

The Adelaide Health and Medical Sciences building brings together more than 1,700 students and 600 health researchers in a vibrant and innovative environment, where learning and discovering work handin-hand. It features state-of-theart simulation suites and cutting-edge technology to incorporate immersive, skills-based learning. With shared, adaptable learning and social environments, the building promotes flexibility, inter-professional learning and collaboration across medicine, nursing, dentistry and health and medical sciences.

The Adelaide Dental School is based in this new Adelaide Health and Medical Sciences building which also houses the new Adelaide Dental Hospital. The hospital is run in partnership with the South Australian Dental Service, and will give dentistry students the opportunity to work alongside professional dentists also based at the clinic. Featuring 89 top quality dental chairs, the clinic will deliver year-round oral health services for disadvantaged members of the community who may otherwise find it difficult to access dental care.

ADELAIDE DENTAL SCHOOL

The Adelaide Dental School is currently experiencing one of the most exciting periods in its long history.

The Adelaide Dental School is one of five schools that comprise the Faculty of Health and Medical Sciences. It is one of the oldest and most distinguished dental schools in Australasia and currently ranked 31st in the world (QS). It provides accredited and clinically focused programs in dentistry and oral health. The school offers a supportive and collegial environment where staff aim to have an internationally recognised impact on oral health education, research and service.

A centre of excellence since 1920, the school is one of the most advanced dental facilities in Australia and a leader in shaping oral health for all Australians. The School has a strong track record of attracting significant competitive research grants, and publishing papers, articles and books across a wide variety of research areas including oral population health, craniofacial biology, genetic determinants of oral health and disease; the oral microbiome, novel therapeutic interventions and stem cell biology.

Students learn from staff who have won national awards for their outstanding teaching, knowledge and practical skills. By undertaking clinical placements and hands on simulation learning, students gain the professional skills and confidence to excel in their chosen career.

Community outreach dental program

Improving the lives of homeless people, the Community Outreach Dental Program provides dental and other health services for people experiencing homelessness or having difficulty accessing conventional care. Run by the Adelaide Dental School, with assistance from a group of dedicated volunteer private dentists and allied health professionals, the centre has provided care for over 860 patients/clients since its establishment in 2011.

The Dental Simulation Clinic

Dentistry and oral health students at the University of Adelaide have the opportunity to perfect their skills in a clinical environment using the latest simulation technology. With 90 individual simulators, dental students will spend more than 550 hours in the simulation clinic as part of their curriculum, while oral health students will receive more than 330 hours of simulation training. This facility is based in the main North Terrace campus.

LIVING IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Lifestyle

Adelaide has a population of 1.3 million people and enjoys a relaxed lifestyle in a safe and clean environment. South Australia is also proud to be Australia's wine capital with popular and award-winning wine regions within one hour's drive of the city.

The city has a diverse range of landscapes that surround the city and stretch out to pristine beaches, and the scenic Adelaide Hills.

Known as the Festival State, South Australia prides itself on art and culture, with Adelaide hosting 400 festivals and events each year – with the Adelaide Cabaret Festival, Adelaide Festival of Arts, Adelaide Fringe Festival and Santos Tour Down Under to name just a few. The city also boasts many farmers markets and laneways with vibrant bars and eateries, where you can find award winning craft beers, small batch spirits, and sample some of South Australia's best food.

Accommodation

There are many levels of accommodation available in Adelaide and generally affordable compared with other cities. As with most cities, accommodation close to the city centre is the most expensive and generally decreases in price towards the outer suburbs.

Getting around

Adelaide has attractive and safe walking and cycling areas, and efficient public transport including buses, trains and trams.

The airport is seven kilometres from the CBD, and the Adelaide Hills and major beaches are less than 30 minutes by car, making the city easy to get around compared with other Australian cities.
