Role purpose

Collect clients from their homes and drive them in a safe and timely manner to their hospital appointments to facilitate access to their essential medical appointments and treatment.

Role responsibilities

- Be available to commit to rostered drives both locally and to Melbourne
- Provide a safe and comfortable transport service for clients attending their appointments
- Respect the confidentiality and privacy of clients
- Support the Patient Transport Convener by communicating roster changes and vehicle maintenance.

Knowledge, skills and experience

- Confident driver with knowledge and comfort driving in Melbourne
- Possess good conversation and listening skills and the ability to relate to people from different backgrounds with ease.
- Are mature, reliable and have confidence to work independently without direct supervision and to seek support and guidance as required.

Check requirements

 A National Criminal History Check prior to commencement and renewed every three years (Red Cross will arrange this)

Learning and development

- Complete Red Cross online learning modules as required
- Attend Red Cross Volunteer Induction, Program Training and ongoing training as required
