ABOUT THE SCHOOL OF PSYCHOLOGY

The National School of Psychology, located within the Faculty of Health Sciences, offers courses on three campuses located in Melbourne, Strathfield (Sydney) and Brisbane. The programs offered include an accredited undergraduate and fourth-year psychology sequence, "5 plus 1" psychology course, professional Master of Psychology programs with specialisations in clinical and in educational and developmental psychology, combined MPsych/PhD degree programs, and undergraduate and postgraduate programs in counselling.



The School has a strong emphasis on quality research and research training outcomes. The research activities of staff relate to three, overlapping areas of strength: (i) cognition and applied cognitive neuroscience; (ii) developmental and educational psychology, and (iii) clinical, health, and counselling psychology. The School has a number of researchers with international profiles in these areas. It has developed new laboratory facilities, supports for new and emerging researchers and scholars, and onshore and offshore collaborations.

POSITION PURPOSE

The EDDV Placement Coordinator will provide support for the administration of the MPsych EDDV professional practica. The EDDV Placement Coordinator will establish and maintain relationships and pathways for the practicum requirements of students enrolled in the EDDV professional psychology program. He/she will provide supervision to the internal practicum placements. The EDDV Placement Coordinator will provide supervision to students as required and in accordance with the relevant accreditation bodies. He/she may also contribute to teaching. He/she will be under the direction of the Coordinator of the Master of Psychology (Educational and Developmental) Program and will work closely with the Clinic Director, who has overall responsibility for the leadership of the Melbourne Psychology and Counselling Clinic (MPACC).
