Role purpose

To deliver engaging educational workshops to build student knowledge and capacity in disaster preparedness. This role is instrumental in targeting our work towards people who may be more at risk from the impacts of emergencies.

Role responsibilities

- Present one hour disaster resilience education workshops to ages 8-10 (Years 3-4) and facilitate discussion with children about emergency preparedness
- Tailor approved Red Cross presentations to suit your presentation style and the needs of the audience
- Support required monitoring, evaluating, and reporting for the program
- Travel to schools in a designated region
- Report and document all incidents or service delivery concerns in accordance with procedures
- Immediately notify State or Territory Coordinators if you cannot attend your rostered session
- Pick up/return equipment and supplies to/from Red Cross offices as needed
- Participate in relevant training sessions
- Attend team meetings as required.

Knowledge, skills and experience

- Ability to engage with large and small groups of children and/or young people
- Willingness to teach new ideas and concepts, such as mindfulness activities
- Ability to problem solve and be flexible in the field
- Ability to be sensitive towards, and respond to, the diverse backgrounds, beliefs, cultures and attitudes of members of the audience
- Basic admin skills and knowledge of Microsoft Office including email

Check requirements

- A National Criminal History Check prior to commencement and renewed every three years (Red Cross will arrange this)
- Working with Children's Check relevant to your state / territory location

Learning and development

- Complete Red Cross online learning modules as required
 - Attend Red Cross Volunteer Induction, Program Training and ongoing training as required
