<p>Purpose: Develop innovative formats for telling news stories on digital platforms such as news apps, data visualisations and other interactive and rich media digital stories associated with news events.</p>	
<p>Key Accountabilities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Work closely with reporters, designers, data journalists and other editorial staff to visualise, develop, test and implement engaging digital stories and interactive content around ABC's in-depth journalism and news events. 2. Develop from concept to realisation a wide range of complex interactive applications and interactive digital presentations, including visualisations of complex data. 3. Develop rich interactive components and applications that enhance audience understanding and engagement, including charts, maps, infographics and data visualisations – at times using a large amount of structured data sourced from both internal content management systems and external APIs. Integrate, test and debug front-end functionality with applications and databases. 4. Actively participate in various forums, such as editorial meetings, to contribute to the development of ideas and leads that result in the creation of engaging news stories on digital platforms. 5. Maintain a high level of awareness of best practice in the industry for areas such as data visualisation, interactive storytelling, emerging standards, accessibility across multiple platforms and search engine optimisation (SEO). 6. Develop and maintain key documentation for solution designs. 7. Work effectively and collaboratively in a team, suggesting ideas and assisting to develop the output needs of others. 8. Actively promote the ABC values and apply all relevant workplace policies and guidelines. All ABC staff are required to cooperate with any reasonable instruction, procedure or policy relating to safety, and take reasonable care for their own safety and that of other persons who may be affected by their conduct while at work. Ability to make recommendations on relevant research, distribution and accessibility of content on digital platforms. 8.
