Animal Care Services is responsible for ensuring that all animals used in research and teaching at the University are housed and cared for to the highest standards of veterinary care and in compliance with all legal and statutory requirements. The appointee will work in any of the Animal Facilities at the University of Western Australia, with an emphasis on the procedural and surgical theatre rooms.

Your role

As the appointee, you will work under direction:

- Provide high standards of care to laboratory animals undergoing anaesthesia and surgery for research training or research purposes
- Assist the Veterinary Officer with anaesthesia, surgery and peri-operative care of animals during various teaching workshops and research projects
- Assist facility staff, as required, with daily animal care and husbandry procedures
- Provide technical support to projects as required.

Key responsibilities

Be responsible for maintaining, and developing further, a high standard of animal care in a theatrebased teaching and research environment where anaesthesia, surgery, peri-operative care and sampling of animals may be required.

Be responsible for the day-to-day administration and coordination of Animal Facility Theatres including management of consumables and other date sensitive supplies.

Be responsible for animal care and transport activities as required for theatre-based teaching and research programs. Coordinate handling, peri-operative care and disposal of animals used for theatre procedures as required.

Ensure all processes and procedures for theatre-based activities are performed according to the Animal Care Services' Standard Operating Procedures, Animal Ethics Committee approval, OGTR, Biosecurity and Safety & Health Policy requirements.

Maintain appropriate records as required by the Animal Ethics Committee and Animal Care Services' Standard Operating Procedures.

Prepare animals for recovery surgery.

Prepare theatres for anaesthesia and surgery, including the preparation of sterile surgical instruments and consumables.

Provide high standards of care for animals before and after surgery.

Handling of a range of species including, but not limited to, mice, rats, rabbits, guinea pigs, sheep and pigs.

Other duties as directed.

Year 12 or equivalent competency.

Certificate IV in Veterinary Nursing, or equivalent.

Experience with theatre nursing, anaesthesia and post-operative care of small and large animals.

Experience in microbiological biocontainment.

Proficiency in a range of computing skills including word processing, spreadsheets, databases, internet and email (Microsoft Office).

Excellent written and verbal communication skills including a team building approach to coordination of the relevant staff, research personnel and students.

Relevant experience in a coordination/supervisory role in an animal facility or veterinary hospital.

Sound knowledge of the Australian Code of practice for the Care and Use of Animals for Scientific Purposes.

Awareness of strict confidentiality & security requirements associated with Animal Facility activities.

Determination to refine procedures regarding husbandry and peri-operative care of animals used in teaching and research.
