Position purpose

Education-focused staff (as a subset of the Teaching and Research category of employment) at Monash are an elite category of the academy who focus on and contribute to the innovation of education and leading the design and delivery of education at the University. The Senior Lecturer (Education-focused) is expected to make significant contributions to teaching and learning within their faculty and engage in educational leadership at department, school, faculty or University level.

The specific responsibility areas include the conduct of tutorials, practical classes, demonstrations, workshops, small group sessions in the Year A medicine program according to their relevant clinical experience, subject material for clinical skills teaching and assessment, program administration, and the coordination of the clinical skills tutors for the delivery of classes in this year of the course.

Key result areas and responsibility

This position is a Level C education-focused academic. Level C education-focused academics will engage in educational scholarship, and/or play a leadership role in educational innovation, curriculum design and review.

The duties of a Level C education-focused academic include:

- 1. The preparation, delivery and coordination of classes
- 2. Course material and resource development
- 3. Development and management of student assessments including web-based tasks, written assignments, insemester clinical skills assessment tasks and objective structured clinical examinations (OSCEs)
- 4. Consultation with students
- 5. Designing, implementing and reviewing educational innovations
- 6. Coordinating a major or field of study or award program
- Engaging in collaborative design or implementation of cross-faculty, cross-campus or team taught units, courses or projects
- 8. Building learning and teaching capacity in fellow academics within the department, school or faculty
- 9. Program administrative functions
- 10. Attendance at departmental, school and/or faculty meetings and a major role in planning or committee work

Research and scholarship for a Level C education-focused academic may include:

- 11. Innovative curriculum design based on systematic and evidence-based review of teaching methods and techniques
- 12. Exploring the impact of changes in curriculum design and teaching practice on student learning
- 13. Publishing educational or disciplinary research in high-quality refereed journals or equivalent (for example, textbooks or teaching resources)
- 14. Attracting funding to undertake projects that enhance student or staff learning and teaching outcomes
- 15. Conference presentations on educational practice and design at local and national conferences
- 16. Having involvement in Honours and Research Higher Degree supervision (where appropriate)

Key selection criteria

- Medical qualifications (i.e. MBBS or MD) recognised in Australia and holds current medical registration with Australian Health Professional Regulation Agency (APRHA). The medical practitioner should have significant clinical experience. A Level C academic may have a doctoral qualification but is more likely to have equivalent professional or clinical experience
- 2. High-level interpersonal skills and proven ability to establish a good working relationship with colleagues and students and to develop and maintain strong professional links with relevant industry and the community

- 3. Proven ability, commitment and passion for engaging in academic activities, taking a leadership role where appropriate
- 4. Evidence of quality teaching in the discipline area (i.e. through evaluations, innovation in presentation and through curriculum development)
- 5. Evidence of scholarship/research engagement as evidenced by publications or equivalent (eg. textbooks, teaching resources or professional project contributions) and where appropriate the securing of external funding
- 6. Ability to plan, organise and achieve work targets, sometimes in demanding circumstances and work harmoniously and constructively with academic colleagues and other University staff
- 7. Ability to promote the discipline both within the University and to the greater community
