Key Responsibilities

Specific duties required of a Level A academic may include:

- 1. Assisting in creating new content for the BPharm(Hons) / MPharm degree, including materials and tools associated with both the on-campus and experiential components of the course
- 2. The conduct of workshops, practicals, and tutorials
- 3. The preparation and/or delivery of lectures provided that skills and experience demonstrate this capacity
- 4. The conduct of research and/or involvement in professional activity
- 5. Consultation with students
- Marking and assessment primarily connected with subjects in which the academic teaches
- 7. Development of subject and teaching material for students for whom the academic has responsibility with appropriate guidance form the unit or course coordinator
- 8. Attendance at departmental, school and/or faculty meetings and/or membership of a limited number of committees

A Level A academic will not be required to teach primarily in subjects which are offered only at Masters level or above. A Level A academic shall work with support and direction from Academic staff classified at Level B and above and with an increasing degree of autonomy as the academic gains in skill and experience. The most complex levels of subject coordination should not be carried out by a Level A academic.

Key Selection Criteria

Education/Qualifications

- 1. The appointee will have:
 - · Completed four years of tertiary study in pharmacy, science or another health sciences degree; or
 - have equivalent qualifications or research or teaching experience; or
 - an honours degree or higher qualifications

Knowledge and Skills

- 2. Possess a high-level of interpersonal skills and demonstrated ability to work independently and as part of a team across both the education and service sections
- 3. Ability to work positively and cooperatively with students, internal and external teams and agencies
- 4. Proven ability, commitment and passion for engaging in research activities
- 5. Demonstrated ability to stimulate, actively engage and educate and given audience
- 6. Current practical experience within an industry related to discipline
- 7. Previous teaching experience in a tertiary environment
