Its core values underpinning our activities are a commitment to:


- A high performance culture designed to achieve international excellence

Your role

The Senior Lecturer will be responsible to the Head of School of Allied Health through the Head of Division of Social Work and Social Policy. The appointee will be motivated to deliver quality teaching and unit co-ordination in social work. S/he will also undertake research and obtain research funding, individually or in collaboration, as well as supervising research students and contribute to the academic environment of the School.

This role is available on a full-time or part-time basis for an initial period of three years with mutually agreed further extensions.

Key responsibilities

Level C

The individual appointed to this position will be expected to:

- Lead high quality classroom and online teaching and tutoring, and unit coordination in Social Work.
- Conduct excellent scholarly research, independently or in collaboration with others, within and external to the School and University.
- Actively seek and attract, independently and/or in collaboration with others, research funding from external sources.
- Supervise undergraduate and /or postgraduate honours, dissertation and research thesis students, including PhD students.
- Undertake administrative duties and service roles as required by the Head of School.

- Participate in School, Faculty and University meetings and committees as required by the Head
 of School.
- Work collaboratively within the teaching teams and support the University's commitment to equity and diversity principles.
- Other duties as directed.

Your specific work capabilities (selection criteria)

Level C

A PhD qualification is essential.

Demonstrated knowledge of, and teaching experience in, Social Work in a university environment. A teaching portfolio is suggested evidence of teaching experience.

Demonstrated ability to administer and coordinate academic units and programs in teaching and learning.

Familiarity with flexible teaching methods, such as case enhanced learning and e-learning.

Demonstrated achievement and experience in obtaining research grants and undertaking research.

Demonstrated achievement and experience to write and publish journal articles and other publications.

Evidence of some supervision of students' research in a university environment.

Demonstrated management and organisational skills and leadership qualities.

Evidence of a high level of interpersonal skills, verbal and written communication, and demonstrated ability to relate well to staff and students at all levels.

Eligibility for membership of the Australian Association of Social Workers.
