Your work area

Established as a department in 1930, the School of Psychological Science at UWA has a proud record of publishing leading science whilst turning out first-rate scientists and practitioners, widely educated in the theory, research and practice of the discipline. With 44 academic staff, Psychological Science has been recognised internationally, with Psychology at UWA ranked 41st in the QS World University rankings and receiving the top rating of 5 (well above world standards) in each of the last three rounds of the national Excellence in Research for Australia (ERA) evaluations. Our high rankings reflect the quality of the Psychological Science staff, our strong undergraduate and postgraduate programs, the School's capacity to attract substantial research grant funding and the impact of our publications.

The School runs several advanced postgraduate courses including a Master of Clinical Psychology and the only Graduate Diploma in Clinical Psychology program in the state. The former being completed in combination with a Ph.D. The School runs the Robin Winkler Clinic which enables Clinical Psychology and Clinical Neuropsychology trainees the opportunity to provide supervised individual and group treatments for people with a wide range of difficulties. A paediatric and adult neuropsychological assessment service is also available through the Clinic.

This clinic offers cutting-edge clinical services by facilitating developments that encourage and build on the synergies between research and practice. For example, it is the home of the Autism Clinic, a collaboration between UWA School of Psychological Science and the Telethon Kids Institute to train and supervise specialists in the diagnosis of autism. It is also the home of our new collaboration with Telethon PATCHES Paediatrics/Telethon KIDS to develop a Graduate Diploma in the assessment and diagnosis of Foetal Alcohol Syndrome Disorders. These two collaborations, alone, have brought in \$3M and \$3.6M of funding respectively. In 2018, a collaboration between the School of Psychological Science, Student Counselling and the Office of Student Life at UWA will lead to placement opportunities within the Robin Winkler Clinic, as part of a new Student Resilience Initiative.

Reporting Structure

Reports to: Professor and Head of School for overall position. In relation to the provision of clinical supervision and other clinical and teaching activities within the Robin Winkler Clinic, this position is managed by the Director of the Robin Winkler Clinic, in consultation with the Head of School.

Your role

The appointee will undertake the teaching and learning, and research activities of an academic clinical psychologist, including:

- Provide support to the Robin Winkler Clinic Director.
- In consultation with the Robin Winkler Clinic Director, assist with the day-to-day running of the Clinic, for example screening referrals, managing waiting lists, and providing on-call clinical assistance, as required.
- Assist the Robin Winkler Clinic Director in the efficient and professional administration, operation, promotion and expansion of services through the Robin Winkler Clinic.
- Coordinate the internal practicum placements for Clinical Psychology and, if required and suitably qualified, for Clinical Neuropsychology students.
- Provide supervision of Clinical Psychology internal placement activities for both paediatric and adult individual and group interventions, where appropriate.
- Contribute to the research activity of the School through involvement in grant-funded research and research publications and through research supervision.
- Assisting in the development and delivery of research-led teaching and evidence-based practice in the School of Psychological Science.
- Any other duties commensurate with the post.

Key responsibilities

RESEARCH & SCHOLARSHIP

- Assist the Robin Winkler Clinic Director to build and sustain a network of contacts with local, national and international universities and other agencies for the purposes of research collaboration and the enhancement of the reputation of the School and University.
- Contribute to the research activity of the School through involvement in grant-funded research and
 research publications that will create significant new knowledge in Clinical Psychology that is
 disseminated through means that will substantially enhance the international reputation of the
 School and University (e.g., publication in highly ranked peer reviewed journals of
 international standing).
- Supervise honours and postgraduate research projects, as appropriate.

TEACHING & LEARNING

- Contribute to the induction of new students and to their client and supervisor allocation for the internal placements.
- Develop and supervise Clinical Psychology internal placement activities for both paediatric and adult individual and group interventions, where appropriate.
- Provide feedback and reports on training and educational activities
- Maintain files that record students' progress in the internal practicum placement units
- Contribute to high quality teaching, specialising in topics relevant to Clinical Psychology, at undergraduate or postgraduate level.
- Help develop and maintain academic standards to world-class level.
- Help develop educational policy and curriculum within Clinical Psychology, and more broadly.
- Respond appropriately to any complaint or grievance from any client, student, supervisor or other stakeholder that may arise in relation to the internal practicums or the Robin Winkler Clinic.

SERVICE

- Support the Director by providing leadership to support the effective administration, record-keeping, and promotion of the Robin Winkler Clinic.
- Work with the Director to develop new specialist clinical services and clinical-research initiatives in consultation with other staff within the School.
- Maintain and develop professional relationships with a variety of community and health agencies to build and maintain the referral bases for the Clinic.
- Represent the discipline at School, Faculty, and University level.
- Help with the administration of courses and assist in other School administration as required.
- Attend School and Faculty meetings.

- A high level of knowledge of laws and ethical standards governing psychological research and practice.
