The Tasmanian State Service is bursting with opportunity for motivated and creative individuals who are passionate about making a positive contribution to this State.



What can I expect?

You will participate in a formal two year Graduate Development Program. The program works across government, meaning you could work within a number of different business areas and agencies throughout the two year duration.



The program is designed to support you in meeting your potential through a combination of formal training, interactive and independent learning and action learning groups.

Each agency has a different approach to structuring your graduate work. You may have one primary work role, or you may rotate between many different roles over the course of your employment.

In addition to this, negotiations will take place to provide you with an opportunity to have a placement in one other agency for up to six months. Any negotiated rotation out of your agency will be in the second year of your employment.
