Complete this form to confirm your eligibility to access Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander specific programs and services provided by the Tasmanian Government.

Guidelines for applicants

To be eligible to access Tasmanian Government Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander programs and services, you must be an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person. This means you must:

- 1. have Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander ancestry, and;
- 2. self-identify as an Aboriginal person and/or Torres Strait Islander, and:
- 3. be recognised as an Aboriginal person and/or Torres Strait Islander by the Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander community in which you live or have lived.

Tasmanian Government agencies require you to complete this form to determine your eligibility for some programs and services. The form includes:

- a statutory declaration (pages 2 and 3); and
- a confirmation statement from an Aboriginal organisation (page 5).

A statutory declaration is a legal document, and making a false declaration is a criminal offence.

The confirmation statement from an Aboriginal organisation must be completed by two authorised signatories from an organisation which is currently registered under the Commonwealth *Corporations (Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander) Act 2006* (you can view a list of registered organisations at www.oric.gov.au), or from the Tasmanian Aboriginal Centre, Tasmanian Aboriginal Child Care Association, Flinders Island Aboriginal Association or Cape Barren Island Aboriginal Association.

Making a false statement in a statutory declaration is a crime punishable under section 113 of the *Criminal Code Act 1924*. The maximum penalty under the Criminal

Code is 21 years imprisonment.

Confidentiality

Personal information will be collected from you for the purpose of determining your eligibility to access Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander specific programs and services delivered by the Tasmanian Government and will be used by relevant Tasmanian Government agencies for the purpose of determining your eligibility in accordance with the *Personal Information Protection Act 2004*. Personal information will be managed in accordance with the *Personal Information Protection Act 2004* and may be accessed by you on request to the relevant Tasmanian Government agency.
