Vaccination Requirements

Health care Workers (HCW's) have an increased risk of acquiring some vaccine preventable diseases and transmitting these diseases to other HCW's, employees, patients, family members and visitors. SA Health has a duty of care and a responsibility under the Worker Health and Safety Act (SA) 2012 to minimise the transmission of vaccine preventable diseases in the workplace.

At Women's & Children Health Network, we strongly encourage you to have the following vaccination however this is not mandatory:

Туре	Frequency/Risk Areas
Influenza	Annually
Hepatitis A	Roles where you will be required to work in the APY lands
COVID-19	One dose of vaccine which the Therapeutic Goods Administration has classified as either approved or recognised in Australia

Serology means the checking for the presence or level of specific antibodies in the blood

If you are successful, you will be required to have a Mask Fit Test - this is mandatory for all roles where you work in a clinical area.
