Creative Curriculum is a space for students to build their disciplinary expertise through collaboration and work-integrated learning and provides a place-based, collaborative and responsive environment that differentiates UTAS' creative offerings. Based in Hobart, this role will also work closely with the Head of Theatre and Performance as it expands its offerings in in the South.
