Purpose

Lead national affairs coverage on a wide range of subjects across all ABC platforms. Play a lead role in key breaking news events across politics and stories of national interest.

Key Accountabilities

- Research, write, compile and present accurate, concise and clear stories and/or lead coverage with significant program impact across platforms in line with the ABC's Editorial Policies on a daily basis.
- Contribute to the development of program style and philosophy. As required, guide coverage for high profile programs including 7:30 and AM.
- Be proactive and consistently lead the discussion of original story ideas with newsroom leadership teams, making a highly creative and innovative contribution to program content.
- Generate stories that are relevant to a broad section of Australians and reflect the cultural, geographic and socio-economic diversity of the country.
- Actively engage with communities to find and tell stories that are relevant for them and in line with the News strategy.

- Research story material, identify suitable sources, and arrange and conduct interviews to support your own and others' output, ensuring a consistently high standard of relevant and compelling content, including complex major coverage under difficult circumstances.
- Present live-to-air reports and contribute to rolling coverage at a consistently high standard and participate in live Q&As of a complex nature.
- Lead editorial initiatives which have noticeable impact on the ABC's public profile; advance ABC strategies, output and audience engagement. Lead editorial teams to successfully complete major and complex story assignments, coverage, projects or programs.
- Seek out opportunities to add value to original material by providing additional links, video and audio for News webpages, revising for other outlets such as News Online. Use other technological/social media opportunities that may become available.
- Broaden the ABC's contact base and develop relationships with key institutions/players. Cultivate
 a broad rage of contacts and regulary update your own contacts book and contribute to
 maintaining the office diary/contact system.
- Take on senior production roles in the newsroom as required and share information and learning
 with colleagues. Have a major focus on team building, leadership and staff development, providing
 coaching and feedback where required, and assist with the selection and assessment of staff as
 required.
- Actively promote the ABC values and apply all relevant workplace policies and guidelines.
- Cooperate with any reasonable instruction, procedure or policy relating to safety and take reasonable care for your own safety and that of other people who may be affected by your conduct while at work. Additional WHS responsibilities apply to Managers and Supervisors, Team Directors, and other Officers.

- 9. Proven ability to work collaboratively and to show leadership in a team environment.
- 10. A demonstrated and ongoing interest and passion in finding and telling stories that reflect Australia's diversity.
- 11. A proven ability to source and maintain contacts across the broader Australian community.
