1. Position purpose

The role of the Bush Link Worker is to provide a mobile service to families living in rural, remote, and geographically and / or socially isolated areas, to provide care and early learning sessions and support. This may include vacation care, playgroups, on-farm care, parenting support, toy libraries and parent resource libraries.

The Bush Link program aims to improve access to appropriate quality children's and family services to facilitate better support and access for families living in area or situations that make access difficult. The Bush Link worker will provide services in a way that promotes human dignity and creates conditions of social justice and equity.

The role of the Bush Link worker is to strengthen relationships, support families, improve children's wellbeing and increase the participation in community life to strengthen family and community functioning. The Bush Link Program will provide a range of services, focussed on strengthening relationships and building parenting and financial management skills, providing support for better community connections as well as services to help newly arrived migrants with their transition to life in Australia.
