POSITION PURPOSE

The Lecturer in Modern History will be located in the history discipline in SOPHIS. The history program teaches units in both history and international studies, and the Lecturer will employ innovative, student-centred pedagogy in a range of classroom and blended learning contexts. The Lecturer is also expected to contribute to the research culture of history at Monash, by developing a quality program of externally-funded research that is published in peer-reviewed journal articles, book chapters and in scholarly monographs.

A Level B academic is expected to make contributions to the teaching effort of the University and to carry out activities to maintain and develop scholarly research and/or professional activities relevant to the profession or discipline.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Specific duties required of a Level B academic may include:

- 1. The conduct of research, including the publication of peer-reviewed journal articles and monographs and the development of external funding applications
- 2. Unit coordination, including the initiation and development of teaching material, online and blended learning resources
- **3.** The conduct of lectures, seminars, tutorials, workshops and student field excursions and the marking and assessment of student work
- 4. Supervision of honours and postgraduate research projects
- 5. Attendance at departmental, school and/or faculty meetings and/or membership of a number of committees
- **6.** Involvement in engagement activities, both within and beyond the University, including with professional and disciplinary associations, key stakeholders, and the broader community

KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

Education/Qualifications

- 1. The appointee will have:
 - A doctoral qualification in history or equivalent accreditation and standing

Knowledge and Skills

- 2. Active engagement in research, as evidenced by the development of research projects and high-quality publications in peer-reviewed journals, chapters in books with quality presses and a scholarly monograph or significant progress towards a book-length project
- 3. Demonstrated ability to attract external funding for research projects, or the capacity to do so
- **4.** Strong record of teaching experience in a tertiary environment, including curriculum development and evidence of innovative pedagogy
- 5. Capacity to undertake administrative tasks and service roles in both the University and the broader profession
- 6. A demonstrated capacity to work in a collegiate manner with other staff in the workplace

OTHER JOB RELATED INFORMATION
