# **POSITION PURPOSE**

A Level B research-only academic is expected to carry out independent and/or team research within the field in which they are appointed and to carry out activities to develop their research expertise relevant to the particular field of research.

The Research Fellow will work closely with one or more of the senior researchers at the CGB on the Centre's key research areas. The Research Fellow will also have the opportunity to conduct independent research, leading to potential future grants and scholarly publications. A high level of autonomy will be expected in terms of initiative and the conduct of work.

#### **KEY RESPONSIBILITIES**

Specific duties required of a Level B research-only academic may include:

- The conduct of research either as a member of a team or independently and the production of publications from that research
- **2.** Contribution to the preparation or, where appropriate, individual preparation of research proposal submissions to external funding bodies
- **3.** Involvement in professional activities including, subject to availability of funds, attendance at conferences and seminars in the field of expertise
- **4.** Administrative functions related to their area of research and occasional administrative functions related to the operation of the Centre
- 5. Occasional contributions to the teaching program within the field of the staff member's research

#### **KEY SELECTION CRITERIA**

### **Education/Qualifications**

- **1.** The appointee will have:
  - A doctoral qualification in any disciplinary areas taught at Monash Business School, preferably with expertise in quantitative data analysis and survey methods

## **Knowledge and Skills**

- 2. Expertise in an area of global business and willingness to contribute to the Centre for Global Business' multidisciplinary agenda
- 3. Evidence of an ability to produce high-quality research outputs
- 4. Excellent interpersonal and written communication skills
- 5. Ability to work both independently and as part of a team
- 6. Ability to work efficiently, meet project timelines, and to demonstrate excellent organisational skills
- 7. Willingness to engage and establish networks with research end-users and stakeholders
