School of Psychology

Deakin's School of Psychology is one of the largest and most progressive psychology departments in Australia. We are one of five Schools within the Faculty of Health, and have a strong presence in Melbourne, Geelong and Warrnambool. At undergraduate level, almost a third of our students study online while they live and work in places as distant as Alaska, as remote as the North-West Kimberley, or as nearby as Box Hill.

TEACHING AND LEARNING

The School offers accredited programs in Psychology at undergraduate and postgraduate levels. The two major undergraduate programs are the Bachelor of Psychological Science and the Bachelor of Psychology (with Honours). We also offer research degrees at Masters and PhD level and accredited professional masters and doctoral programs in Clinical and Organisational Psychology.

There are two things that really distinguish our teaching programs from others.

The first is relevance: Our teaching programs focus on providing the knowledge and skill-base that make our graduates highly valuable in the employment market. We prepare our students so, regardless of the level of study at which they graduate, they understand the employment opportunities available to them, what employers look for in potential employees, how to market themselves, and how they can develop themselves and their careers over their working lives.

The second is flexibility: We are national and international leaders in providing flexible learning options for students. Our undergraduate programs are available both on campus and online, so students can choose to study face-to-face or in the cloud environment or a mix of both. 'Online' no longer means 'alone': the same level of interaction and support from our staff is available regardless of the mode in which any student chooses to study. Deakin's trimester system allows students to fast-track their undergraduate program to the extent that it is possible to complete in just two years.

RESEARCH AND RESEARCH TRAINING

The School of Psychology is home to over 130 research/academic staff and 170 PhD students. Our flagship research centre is the Centre for Social and Early Emotional Development (SEED), which is focused on the developmental and intergenerational factors that contribute to healthy social and emotional development of children and young adults. We also have significant profiles in substance misuse and addiction, violence prevention, reproductive health, neurodevelopmental disorders, body image and eating disorders, well-being, disability, forensic psychology, and e-Mental Health, among others. Much of this work is carried out through one of our research hubs, several of which overlap with SEED. They include:

- Australian Centre for Behavioural Research in Diabetes (ACBRD)
- Deakin Child Study Centre (DCSC)
- Cognitive Neuroscience Unit (CNU)
- Centre for Drug Use, Addictive and Anti-Social Behaviour Research (CEDAAR)
- Australian Centre on Quality of Life (ACQOL)

The School has significant clinical and research partnerships with industry bodies. Some examples of these include: Barwon Health, Murdoch Children's Research Institute, Diabetes Australia, Eastern Health, Monash Health, Australian Unity, Turning Point, Youth Substance Abuse Service, Odyssey House, Yooralla, and the Victoria Police. These partnerships are central to our mission to answer questions that make a difference to the communities we inhabit and serve.

RESEARCH LEVEL B

This position is jointly funded as a Deakin University partnership with Odyssey House Victoria (Odyssey). Odyssey is a specialist Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) organisation that promotes opportunities for change and growth by reducing drug use, improving mental health, and reconnecting people to their families and the community. Odyssey has been providing high quality, client responsive, drug and alcohol treatment and support services since its establishment in 1979. Supporting more than 8,000 people each year, Odyssey operates a range of community based and residential programs and activities across Victoria. Visit www.odyssey.org.au for more information. Staff at Deakin University and Odyssey have previously completed a range of successful research collaborations.

POSITION PURPOSE

This position is a maternity leave cover position that will continue to contribute to the clinical research partnership with Odyssey House Victoria and the Centre for Drug use, Addictive and Antisocial behaviour Research (CEDAAR) at Deakin University. The Research Fellow will be required to oversee and manage the delivery of an intervention, conduct a process and outcome

evaluation of the intervention, supervise postgraduate students, undertake and participate in research projects, publish and identify and contribute to attracting research funding in the area of Alcohol and Drug problems with a particular focus on forensic issues, and interventions to facilitate healthy and positive social relationships with family, partners and others. The appointee will promote Odyssey House and the School of Psychology/Faculty of Health and the Centre for Drug, Alcohol and Addiction Research and establish and maintain links and partnerships with the academic, industry and professional communities. The appointee will make an independent contribution to the School's research and build research capacity in the partner organisation.

ORGANISATIONAL RELATIONSHIP

The appointee will contribute to an annual cycle of strategically planned partnership activities that foster a collaborative clinical research program between Odyssey House and Deakin University. These activities will be developed by the partnership steering committee in conjunction with the appointee. The appointee will be actively involved in research, student supervision, industry partnerships, and professional activity at Odyssey House. The appointee will interact

regularly with other staff within the School and the Faculty, their peers in other universities, both nationally and internationally, and with community, professional and industry organisations. The appointee will liaise with students at all levels and assist with the coordination of student research.

The appointee is responsible for:

- Fostering the clinical research partnership between Odyssey House and CEDAAR, Deakin University.
- Managing the implementation of a trial intervention, and the process and outcome evaluation of the intervention.
- Building research capacity in the partner organisation.
- Contributing to research, scholarly publications and the generation of research funding related to Alcohol and Other Drug issues with a focus on developing and evaluating interventions related to forensic issues, including violence prevention, as well as interventions for building healthy social and family relationships.
- Developing and nurturing links and partnerships with industry, professional bodies and the wider community.
- Supervising postgraduate research students, ensuring
