The role of Senior Lecturer reports to the Head of School and has no direct reports.

Accountabilities

Specific accountabilities for this role include:

- Advance and disseminate a well-defined teaching philosophy and a critically reflective teaching practice
 that inspires student learning, engagement, and employability.
- Design and develop inclusive learning activities and resources, and assessment and feedback at both course and program level using a range of suitable approaches and learning environments including team-based and transdisciplinary approaches.
- Lead the design and development of experimental approaches to teaching and learning and participate in the exchange of these approaches with colleagues.
- Conduct classes, assess student learning achievements, and support students in both postgraduate and undergraduate courses in line with UNSW policy.
- Manage course administration as Course Authority, including academic quality assurance.

- Facilitate learning progression with students as individuals (through such things as one-to-one consultation) and as a cohort (through general course related advice) to achieve positive learning and employability outcomes for students.
- Work collaboratively to identify and apply for education funding opportunities.
- Maintain professional development in pedagogy, disciplinary knowledge, and minimum professional
 accreditation requirements (where relevant) and advance a deep engagement with industry for
 educational impact.
- Make a positive contribution to School meetings and seminars and be a member of School/Faculty committees as required.
- Actively contribute to and lead (where relevant) the development of the relevant school's education portfolio, including face to face, hybrid, and fully online programs.
- Work collaboratively with peers across the UNSW in all aspects of academic endeavour, develop learning and teaching strategies and resources and contribute to an exchange of teaching ideas, and mentoring of staff as part of the UNSW Education community of practice and scientia education academy.
- Actively stays up to date with discipline and transdisciplinary knowledge and development and translates it to the classroom.
- Ensure hazards and risks are identified and controlled for tasks, projects and activities that pose a health and safety risk within your area of responsibility.
- Align with and actively demonstrate the <u>UNSW Values in Action: Our Behaviours</u> and the <u>UNSW Code</u>

- Demonstrated success in initiating curriculum development and continuous improvement.
- Evidence of highly developed interpersonal and organisational skills.
- Demonstrated experience in leading in a teaching team and collaborating across teaching teams.
- Demonstrated ability to interact with the profession and industry and attract funding for learning and teaching initiatives.
