

Role purpose

The role of the Meet and Greet volunteer provides information about services and facilities to the public within the Bundaberg Base Hospital. You will assist visitors by providing directions or escorting them to wards or departments.

Role responsibilities

- To communicate respectfully with all individuals including patients, customers and staff
- Provide information to visitors about the hospital services and facilities
- Escort patient and visitors to various wards and department, as required
- Respond to general enquires about local amenities, including hospital cafeterias, rest rooms, local coffee shops, taxis, public transport and parking
- Reassure people if they appear distressed or confused
- Maintain the Meet and Greet front reception day books
- Follow direction of the Hospital Volunteer Services Coordinator
- Work within the guidelines of the Hospital polices and procedures

Knowledge, skills and experience

- Excellent communication and listening skills
- Ability to follow direction
- Ability to relate and engage with people from a diverse cross section of the community
- Ability to work as part of a team
- Ability to maintain confidentiality of information

Check requirements

- Red Cross requires A National Criminal History Check prior to commencement and renewed every five years (Red Cross will arrange this)
- If you are successful in the role you will need to undertake further onboarding checks and induction with the Bundaberg Base Hospital – including a Working with Children Check (blue

card), Mandatory training (health service induction, fire safety, infection control, and code of conduct) and immunisation. The hospital will cover all costs

- Attend Red Cross Volunteer Induction, Program Training and ongoing training as required
