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### Overview

The Associate Research Fellow will conduct activities in the area of behavioural neuroscience. The incumbent will be required to manage and assist c project "Prefrontal dopamine in the dynamic processes of learning across lifetime", which involves tasks including but not limited to: behavioural training, tissue collection/sectioning, surgeries, voltammetry, tissue processing (e.g., immunohistochemistry), and microscopy imaging in rodents. The incumbent will contribute to all facets of the project including administrative and laboratory duties. The Associate Research Fellow will work closely with the Future Fellow and other staff employed on the project. The incumbent will also be required to organise and attend relevant meetings, communicating with the Molecular Psychiatry Laboratory members. The incumbent will be based primarily at Deakin Downtown (Docklands) and the Florey Institute of Neuroscience and Mental Health (Parkville).

## Responsibilities

- Conduct high-quality research, scholarship, and creative activities generating high impact outputs with
  mentorship including execution of experiments including but not limited to rodent behavioural training, tissue
  collection/sectioning, surgeries, tissue processing (e.g., immunohistochemistry), and microscopy imaging in
  rodents.
- Supervise and train more junior staff including higher degree research students (PhD, Masters, Honours)
- Undertake general administrative duties involved in managing a laboratory.
- Manage or provide significant assistance to the operations of the research laboratory including maintaining laboratory equipment and materials, the disposal of waste and the ordering of supplies
- Data entry and analysis and preparation of results and reports as requested by the Future Fellow
- Support and may lead applications for funding for research and creative activities
- Begin building body of work and reputation and recognition for quality, excellence and impact
- Participate in intra- and inter-disciplinary research collaborations
- Provide administrative and financial management support for research projects and programs including the maintenance and use of electronic and paper based information systems, databases and records
- Keep abreast of developments, activities and protocols in area of expertise through liaison with staff and peers, reading relevant literature and attendance at relevant seminars
- Remain up to date with current literature and methods relevant to the area of responsibilities
- Attend other meetings as appropriate, such as Institute / School meetings and / or membership of a limited number of Committees

Research Fellow will work closely with the Florey Institute of Neuroscience and Mental Health and the
University of Melbourne. The IMPACT Institute has extensive collaborations with other institutions both locally
and internationally.

- PhD in a psychology, neuroscience, biomedicine, or other related discipline with a and/or other relevant qualifications and experience
- Experience in a variety of laboratory techniques, with an emphasis on rodent handling and behavioural training experience
- Surgery in small animals
- Background knowledge and techniques in molecular and cellular biology
- Developing track record in the field of neuroscience. Research experience that has resulted in publications, conference papers, reports, or professional or technical contributions, which give evidence of research ability.
- Demonstrated ability to analyse information and produce clear, succinct reports and documents with reliability, accuracy and attention to detail
- High level planning and organisational skills, with the ability to prioritise multiple tasks and set and meet deadlines
- Demonstrated ability to work as part of a team with excellent interpersonal skills and a proven ability to
  establish good working relationships with colleagues and proven oral, written communication and
  presentation skills.
