What You'll Do

- Provide analytical support to data analytics and strategy team members.

- Assist senior analysts in gathering requirements from internal stakeholders on their analytics needs.
- Utilise data analytics systems, such as the enterprise data warehouse, Power BI, Tableau, and/or Alteryx, to create data-driven and meaningful insights for stakeholders in order to improve decisionmaking.
- Work with the strategic analytics team in building datasets suitable for reporting analysis.
- Undertake other duties as assigned by the supervisor.
