This includes, but is not limited to, the preparation and delivery of lectures and tutorials, the preparation of online material, marking and assessment, consultations with students, acting as a subject coordinator, the initiation and development course/subject material and actively lead overall curriculum development in the discipline and across the College.
- 3. Undertaking high impact independent research in the area of Applied Epidemiology with a view to publishing original and innovative results in international refereed journals, presenting research at academic seminars and at prestigious national and international conferences, and collaborating with other researchers at an international level.
- 4. Actively seeking and securing external funding including the preparation and leadership of major multi party collaborative research proposals.
- 5. Providing leadership and direction for the MAE Program to effectively manage its administration, staffing and resources.
- 6. Supervising MAE students or scholars working on individual or group projects.
- 7. Liaising with staff within the School/College to ensure integrated and shared engagement in teaching and research relevant to the MAE program.
- 8. Leading and initiating community outreach activities including to prospective students, research institutes, industry, government, the media and the general public.
- 9. Maintaining and actively promoting high academic standards in all education, research and administration endeavours undertaken by the School, the College and the University.
