Role purpose

The Volunteer Driver role assists the Lady Lawley Cottage team with transporting children to and from school, medical appointments, excursions and activities using a Red Cross vehicle.

Peak times of need are Monday-Friday, 8-10am and 2-4pm and occasional assistance with excursions on weekends at a variety of times.

Role responsibilities

- Transport staff and young people of Lady Lawley Cottage to offsite activities using LLC vehicles
- Maintain accurate log book records and key register for vehicles
- Refuel and maintain the cleanliness of the interior/exterior of the vehicle
- Ensure the safety of children and staff in line with Red Cross policies
- Participate and complete ongoing training development as required

Knowledge, skills and experience

- Conversational English Skills
- Patience
- Flexibility and willingness to assist where needed
- Competent and confident in driving large vehicles (max capacity 11 people)

Check requirements

- A National Criminal History Check prior to commencement and renewed every three years (Red Cross will arrange this)
- A current West Australian Working with Children's Check
- Current Drivers Licence

Learning and development

- Complete Red Cross online learning modules as required
- Attend Lady Lawley Cottage Vehicle Orientation Session
- Attend Red Cross Volunteer Induction, Program Training and ongoing training as required
- Attend scheduled volunteer meetings, a minimum of two per year

General conditions
