At ACU, participation in sport is valued as one of the cornerstones to a students' university experience. We recognise the important role that sport plays in our students' education, and how practicing virtue through sport supports students' academic pursuits.

POSITION PURPOSE

The Elite Athlete and Performer Program Coordinator is responsible for the delivery of the Elite Athlete and Performer Program (EAPP) which has been established to support ACU Elite Athlete and Performer students achieve academic excellence whilst pursuing a sporting career. These students face tremendous challenges in achieving both academic and sporting, or performance success during their time at University and the Elite Athlete and Performer Program has been implemented at ACU to support these students in a variety of ways. The Elite Athlete and Performer Program Coordinator is responsible for facilitating the guiding principles established by Sport Australia's Elite Athlete Education Network including the provision of advice and guidance to student athletes, support in negotiating flexible study arrangements (assessment, enrolment and course related needs) and advocacy. The position plays a key role in promoting a sense of belonging to the University to improve engagement and satisfaction for ACU Elite Athlete and Performer students.

SELECTION CRITERIA
