POSITION PURPOSE

A Level C academic is expected to make significant contributions to the teaching effort of a department, school, faculty or other organisational unit or an interdisciplinary area. An academic at this level is also expected to play a major role in scholarship, research and/or professional activities.

In consultation with the Head of Fine Art and Course Director, the academic will coordinate, develop curriculum and teach offerings in the core studio and elective programmes in Fine Art. They will also be able to communicate the value of practice-based research to a broad range of stakeholders and publics, in addition to responding to the research agendas and priorities of the University, faculty and/or department.

Drawing on extensive specialist technical and material skills that align with the current interdisciplinary programme foci, the academic must have the knowledge and practical experience of multiple media processes in relation to the development of pedagogical approaches, and university policies and processes. The academic will have the ability to engage and manage the teaching of creative practices in a dynamic manner through various discursive and theoretical contexts.

The following modes of art practice can be considered: digital media, glass, painting, sculpture, performance, printmaking and public art.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Specific duties required of a Level C academic may include:

- 1. The conduct of tutorials, practical classes, demonstrations, workshops, student field excursions, clinical sessions and/or studio sessions
- 2. Initiation and development of course material
- 3. Course coordination
- **4.** The preparation and delivery of lectures and seminars
- 5. Supervision of major honours or postgraduate research projects

- **6.** Supervision of the program of study of honours students and of postgraduate students engaged in course work
- **7.** The conduct of research
- 8. Significant role in research projects including, where appropriate, leadership of a research team
- 9. Involvement in professional activity
- 10. Consultation with students
- 11. Broad administrative functions
- 12. Marking and assessment
- **13.** Attendance at departmental, school and/or faculty meetings and a major role in planning or committee work
- 14. Other duties as directed from time to time

KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

Education/Qualifications

- 1. The appointee will have:
 - A doctoral qualification in the relevant discipline area or equivalent accreditation and standing and/or recognised significant experience in the relevant discipline area.

Knowledge and Skills

- 2. Demonstrated strong record of teaching experience in a tertiary environment including curriculum development and course coordination
- 3. Demonstrated management in online teaching platforms and their use in facilitating innovative teaching practices
- 4. Evidence of leading collaborative and interdisciplinary teaching projects
- **5.** Demonstrated record of successfully supervising and/or teaching postgraduate research and coursework students
- **6.** An acknowledged record of research practice in fine art, demonstrated through a publication record in high-quality exhibition programs, refereed journals, conferences and their equivalent
- 7. Capacity to communicate the value and impact of practice-based research and to translate this within the research priorities of the University, faculty and/or department
- **8.** Demonstrated ability to attract external funding in the form of both national competitive grants and other research income
- **9.** Possess a high level of interpersonal skills to liaise and advocate for the department with external stakeholders, industry and broad public
- **10.** A demonstrated capacity to work in a collegiate manner with other staff in the workplace to foster community on a creative campus
