### **Austin Health**

Austin Health is one of Victoria's largest health care providers. Comprising of the Austin Hospital, Heidelberg Repatriation Hospital, Royal Talbot Rehabilitation, Hospital in the Home and community-based health services; Austin Health is an internationally recognised leader in clinical teaching, training and research, with numerous university and research institute affiliations.

Austin Health employs near 9,000 staff across its sites; including over 1,600 doctors, 3,000 nurses and 1,000 therapy & science and allied health staff. Austin Health delivers a full range of leading edge clinical services, including several state-wide services (liver transplant, spinal cord injury service, respiratory support service, child inpatient mental health service). In total, Austin Health provides over 900 beds, including mental health, aged-care and rehabilitation beds and a range of community and in the home services. The current annual operating budget is in excess of \$960 million.

### **Nursing at Melbourne**

First established at The University of Melbourne in 1996, we believe that clinical practice and practice-based research are integral to the educational preparation of all nurses at all levels of professional practice.

The qualifying degree in Nursing at Melbourne is the Master of Nursing Science. This degree is open to graduates from a range of undergraduate degree programs. The Department also offers eight specialist Graduate Certificate courses, one Graduate Diploma course and four Advanced Practice courses (including the Master of Advanced Nursing Practice Nurse-Practitioner).

In research, the Department of Nursing is progressing a dynamic health services research comprising five streams, each led by a senior academic, mid and early career researchers and research teams.

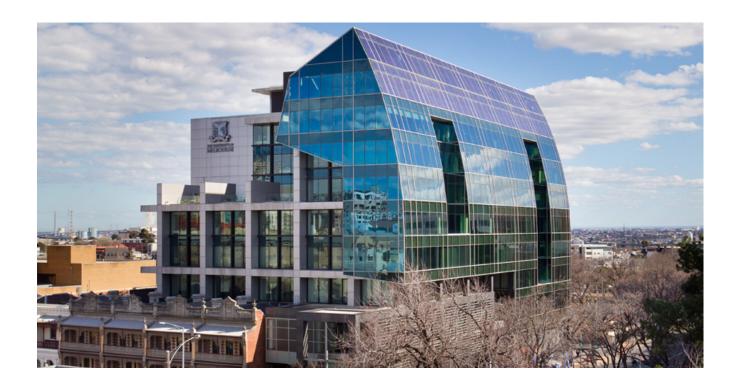
The streams include;

- Cancer and Palliative Care
- Emergency and Critical Care
- Infant and Child Health
- Informatics and Digital Health
- Mental Health.

This comprehensive program of work focuses on understanding and addressing: patterns of health service utilisation, variations in access to and the delivery of care, the efficiency, quality and safety of the health system and consumer co-design of health service improvements. This research program is concerned with where and how nurse-led interventions, in the context of multi-disciplinary models of care, value add to patient, system level and population outcomes.

The Department is also home to the Centre for Psychiatric Nursing.

## The Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences

The Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences (MDHS) is Australia's pre-eminent medical, health sciences and biomedical faculty and is recognised for its research, teaching, training and policy leadership across all of these fields.

The Faculty employs more than 2,500 members of staff, attracts more than 8,800 students each year and comprises six schools; 37 departments, centres and institutes; and 160 courses. It contributes almost 50 per cent of all research conducted across the University.

The Faculty is Australia's overall leader in clinical, pre-clinical and health sciences and is ranked 11th globally for 2021 by the Times Higher Education World University Rankings. In the field of clinical medicine, the Academic Ranking of World Universities ranks the University of Melbourne as first in Australia and 13th in the world as at 2020. The University educates more health professionals, graduates, research and higher degree students and attracts more national competitive funding than any other Australian university.

Consistent with the introduction of the Melbourne Model, the Faculty offers a suite of professional entry masters level graduate programs, including the Doctor of Medicine (MD), the Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS), and the Doctor of Physiotherapy (DPT). There are also a number of other successful graduate level programs such as the Master of Nursing Science, Master of Public Health, Master of Social Work, Master of Clinical Audiology, Master of Speech Pathology, Master of Clinical Optometry, and many more.

University departments are embedded in a range of health services including the Austin Hospital, Northern Hospital, Royal Melbourne Hospital, St Vincent's Hospital, The Royal Women's Hospital and rural partners such as Goulburn Valley Health.



The Faculty employs over 1,300 academic research staff. Hospital departments employ 39% of MDHS academic staff. The University has over 2,000 hospital-based honorary staff and more than 500 honorary staff in partner institutes.



These programs which are unparalleled in the Australian higher education system provide new approaches to educating healthcare professionals and are specifically designed to better align student attributes to the sector's needs.

The Faculty has strong collaborative links within the Melbourne Biomedical Precinct, as well as with many leading national and global research institutes, clinical centres and health-related industries. These collaborations provide students, researchers, educators and clinical academics with excellent resources and infrastructure. They have led to significant medical breakthroughs; and fostered new world-class facilities such as the Victorian Comprehensive Cancer Centre, the Melbourne Brain Centre, the Peter Doherty Institute and the Royal Children's Hospital campus.

#### **Melbourne Biomedical Precinct**

The Faculty is a key collaborator within the Melbourne Biomedical Precinct – a leading global research and teaching hub and one of the top five biomedical precincts in the world. Precinct partners share an impressive history of ground-breaking medical discoveries and developments, as well as a future-focused outlook on innovative and transformative healthcare. The 30 precinct partners, located within easy reach of each other, are engaged in breakthrough research, education and the delivery of clinical care and health services. This dense concentration of hospitals, research facilities and academic campuses provides the opportunity, unparalleled in Australia, for talented individuals from a range of disciplines to engage in world-class collaborations.

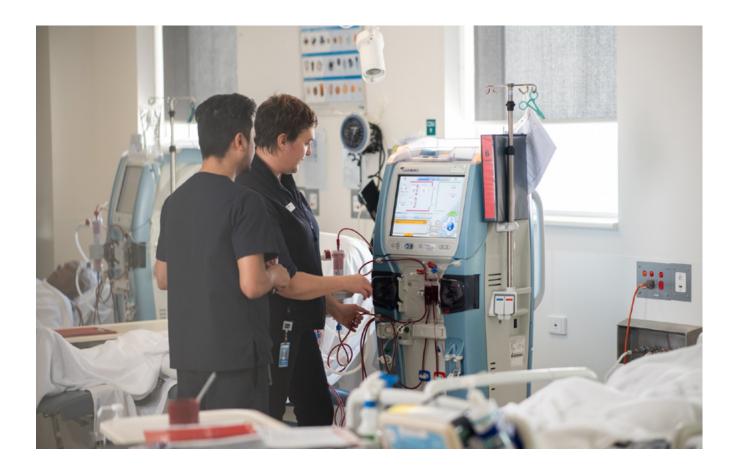


## The University of Melbourne

### **Position Summary**

The Associate Professor of Nursing will be a joint position between the Department of Nursing at Austin Health and the Department of Nursing, Melbourne School of Health Sciences, The University of Melbourne.

Physically located onsite at Austin Health, the Associate Professor of Nursing will make an independent and original contribution to the advancement of knowledge through interdisciplinary collaboration and leadership in nurse-led health services research. This leadership will extend across knowledge generation, implementation, research training, teaching and practice.

The appointee will be expected to foster the translation of research findings by nurses that ensures the delivery of safe, evidence-based and person-centred nursing care. They will be actively involved in clinical research and have a visible and growing track record in managing a high-level research agenda as well as facilitating and supporting capacity and capability building in nursing research at Austin Health.

Working closely with key stakeholders across the hospitaluniversity partnership the Associate Professor of Nursing will generate high quality clinical research targeting the health and well-being of patients, carers and families attending the health service.

The appointee will make a significant contribution to the strategic directions, growth, mentorship and ongoing development of clinical research, including research training at Austin Health and the Department of Nursing, Melbourne School of Health Sciences. In doing so, they will enhance the academic standing of Austin Health, the Department of Nursing, Melbourne School of Health Sciences, the Faculty and The University.

As an Associate Professor of The University of Melbourne, the appointee will demonstrate a significant contribution to research at a national level and make independent and original contributions to scholarship within disciplinary and interdisciplinary contexts. This standing will be demonstrated by an excellent publication and grant track record.

### **Key Responsibilities**

As Associate Professor of Nursing at Austin Health will lead the development of a nurse-led health services research at Austin Health Nursing Research Collaborative.

Additionally, the appointee will:

- Foster clinical research training and development of research capabilities of Austin nursing staff
- Attract funding to support evidence-based research into the development, implementation and evaluation of nursing interventions
- Provide leadership, mentoring, advocacy and supervision in research for nursing staff at Austin Health
- Facilitate translation of research into improved clinical care and outcomes
- Provide onsite support for clinical research projects, including obtaining ethics, designing research based upon answerable clinical questions and developing an in-service program of research training for nurses
- Foster linkages between other departments and institutes at Austin Health and the University of Melbourne
