Classification: School Operational Services Level 2

Position Objective

An Employee whose principal duties are to support the other services of a school, including but not limited to cleaning, building and grounds maintenance, retailing — canteens, uniform shops; and bus driving and vehicle maintenance.

Knowledge, Skills and Experience

- o applies knowledge and skills to a range of tasks and roles;
- usually works within routines, methods and procedures, but some discretion is involved in selection of equipment, work organisation, services and actions;
- is provided with routine supervision of straightforward tasks, moving to general direction. Cleaners at this level are responsible for the supervision of other School Operational Services Employees; and
- does not have a trade qualification (certificate III), but has a skill level which assumes and requires knowledge, training or experience relevant to the duties to be performed.

Major Accountabilities

- non-specialised repair work;
- undertaking general gardening tasks including preparation and planting procedures;
- o operating, maintaining and adjusting turf machinery under general supervision;
- applying fertilisers, fungicides, herbicides and insecticides under general supervision;
- responding to alarms, following emergency procedures and preparing incident reports, inspecting and securing buildings;
- providing assistance to qualified tradespersons in building and furniture maintenance;
- undertake any other duties as requested by the Principal and/or Principal's Delegate. This may include operation of the school's security system when commencing/finishing a shift.

Requirements of the Position

- Employees are required to support the mission, teachings and ethos of the Catholic Church's work in schools
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively both independently and as part of a team.

- Demonstrated ability to follow direction, prioritise and meet set deadlines.
- Demonstrated interpersonal skills in working with a range of personnel.

Work Health and Safety

- Maintenance and outdoor work must be performed within nominated areas and hours to ensure that Work Health and Safety and security policies, procedures and arrangements are not breached.
- Personal protective equipment is provided and must be used for specific tasks. This includes sun protection for workers engaged in outdoor activities.
