Role Context

The Social Work and Psychology department at Mater Health provides a broad range of public and private acute health services with adults, women's health, neonatology, children and adolescent services. The Mater Mothers Social Work team provides specialist services to inpatients and outpatients in the areas of Mother's, Babies and Women. The team encompasses approx. 8 FTE of Social Workers and 1.8 Social Work Assistants.
